Fredericton Climbs Nearer Top of League

St. Croix Narrowly Escaped a Shutout here Yesterday Losing 4 to 1—Bangor Beat St. John 5 to 4 Winning out in Ninth Inning—Dave Morey Pitched Great Ball for Pets

Fredericton climbed nearer the top of the league yesterday by beating the St. Croix team 4 to 1. Lynch saved St. John's Border team from a shutout by clouting the ball over the left field fence in the ninth inning for a home-run. The game was close and exciting from start to finish and one of the best seen here this season. Dave Morey and "Dutch" Howard had a pitchers' battle from start to finish with the Fredericton twirler having the better of it. Up to the seventh inning Fredericton had touched Howard for but three hits. In that fatal session they pounded him for four—a triple, a double and a brace of singles—and four runs came in. The Pets backed up out Mr. Morey in noble fashion while the Border team fell down on three occasions, the infield being guilty of all the lapses.

ST. CROIX'S SCORE.

The Pets disposed of the St. Croix batters almost like clockwork. There were three faced Morey in the first inning. Lynch drew a pass but was caught stealing. McPherson and Tetrault fled out. In the second Jacobson fanned. Parker got a hit but Murphy caught him stealing. Vance was hit by pitcher but Wildes fled out. In the third Bob Conley threw out both Gross and Howard. Lynch pounded out a two-bagger to Bob Ganley's territory but McPherson was fielded out by "Hank" Callahan and any trouble averted. In the fourth Morey started strong, striking out Tetrault and Jacobson. Conley threw Parker out. In the fifth St. Croix did not hit out of the diamond. Vance hit to Stone. Wildes struck out. Gross drew a pass but Howard fled out to the pitcher.

The sixth was largely a repetition. Keaney and Callahan threw out McPherson and Lynch and Tetrault hit to Stone. Keaney had the assists for both Jacobson and Parker in the seventh and rounded things off by chasing Vance's fly back of third base and getting it. In the eighth, one, two, three again. Keaney threw Wildes out. Gross fled out to Ganley and Howard was fielded out to Callahan. In the ninth the Pets were cheated by Fate out of a shutout. Lynch did it. He hammered one of Morey's slants right along the left foul line and over the fence and completed the circuit on it. McPherson was fielded out by Keaney but Tetrault hit safely and it looked almost like a St. Croix batting rally. He took second on a passed ball and a hit meant a run. Jacobson fled out to Duggan, however, and Parker sent a long fly out to right field. It almost looked as if Bert White would miss it but he did not and the game was over.

HOW WE WON.

Fredericton made several threats at getting going before the lucky seventh. In the first Keaney was thrown by Lynch and Ganley fled out to Jacobson. Duggan was safe on an error by McPherson and stole second. Gross caught him stealing third, however. The second started badly but improved. Stone fouled out to Gross and Conley hit to the pitcher being thrown out. Bert White came along with a nice single. Callahan did likewise. The ball was thrown to third base to catch White but arrived too late. Lynch got it to second in time to get Callahan who tried to take second on the throw, retiring the side. The third should have produced a score and with more "pep" on the part of base-runners and coaches would have done so. Murphy started things with a nice single to left-field. Dave Morey laid down a nice sacrifice and when it comes to per forming that particular kind of evolution you must hand it to Dave. Lynch went in for the ball and threw the batter out. Murphy naturally took second on the play but he and the coaches entirely overlooked the fact that the third bag was not covered. Murphy should have gone on to third and from that bag scored when Keaney fled out. Bob Ganley hit to Vance and the inning was over. In the fourth the side was retired on flies to the outfield. Bob Conley reached second on an error by Lynch in this inning but did there. Callahan fled out to Vance in the fifth and Howard came across with couple of strike-outs for Murphy and Morey. In the sixth there was little more Keaney and Ganley flying out and

Duggan being thrown out by Howard.

THE LUCKY SEVENTH.

It all happened in the seventh and Stone started it. He rapped out a single in the direction of Jacobson. Bob Conley was passed. White went out trying to bunt on the third strike but Callahan came to the rescue with a fine two-base hit, scoring Stone. Murphy retired by the pop-foul route but Dave Morey selected a nice offering of Mr. Howard and jammed it into the pines for three bases. Morey's general attitude and speed in making third base reminded many of that giant of the New Brunswick woods, the moose, when he has received a slight scare. Two runs came on, making the score three, but Keaney made things surer with a single which sent Morey across the pan. Bob Ganley went out McPherson to Vance. In the eighth there were prospects of more runs but they never were fulfilled. Duggan drew a pass and stole second, although base-stealing was decidedly not the caper. "P. J." continued on his burglarizing career and Gross caught him trying to purloin third. Pitcher Howard then pulled a surprise by winging over three that Stone could not hit—result, two out. Mr. Lynch then came along with another error that left Conley safe. A base on balls to White put men on first and second but Callahan hit to Wildes, who put White out at second.

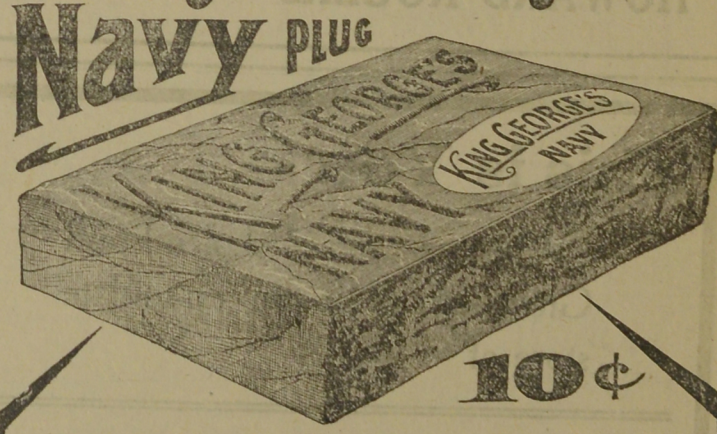
