

CHEAPER CABLE RATES

(Continued from page one.) The rates which the new wireless

company undertakes to give are approximately 25 per cent. lower than the rates now given by the cable companies. Ordinary messages will cost four pence per word and press messages two pence as compared with present cable rates of twelve pence and three and a half pence. Reductions on other classes of messages are somewhat less. The contract is for five years and the system must be inaugurated within a year from the signing of the conract.

The rates charged and the general onditions of operation will be undr the control of a sub-committee of he privy council to be known as the Cean Telegrapher Board to be comosed of the postmaster general and the minister 'of marine, railways and oublic works.



BRIDE RECIPIENT **OF MANY PRESENTS**


