CHEAPER CABLE RATES

(Continued from page one.)

The rates which the new wireless company undertakes to give are approximately 25 per cent. lower than the rates now given by the cable companies. Ordinary messages will cost four pence per word and press messages two pence as compared with present cable rates of twelve pence and three and a half pence. Reductions on other classes of messages are somewhat less. The contract is for five years and the system must be inaugurated within a year from the signing of the contract.

The rates charged and the general conditions of operation will be under the control of a sub-committee of the privy council to be known as the Ocean Telegrapher Board to be composed of the postmaster general and the minister of marine, railways and public works.

Hon. Mr. Pelletier in introducing the bill, at the opening of the house said that while in England last year he had suggested to the British postmaster general a proposal for an Atlantic state-owned cable. The suggestion, however, had been turned down on the ground that the advance of wireless telegraphy made doubtful the wisdom of embarking at the present time on an outlay of \$5,000,000 for a state-owned cable, whereas a wireless system could be installed for about \$400,000.

London, April 22.—The beautiful Guards Chapel at Wellington Barracks, was a very fitting centre for the wedding of Captain Rivers-Bulkeley and Miss Evelyn Pelly on Saturday.

The bride and bridegroom were the recipients of many beautiful gifts, and as an evidence of the esteem of their many friends in Canada, those which came from the Dominion were particularly appreciated. The king and queen presented to the bride an enamel brooch forming the royal cipher and surmounted by a crown in brilliant and to the bridegroom a silver inkstand. Queen Alexandra gave a brooch of opals and diamonds and a pair of jewelled sleeve links. Princess Victoria sent a set of silver salt cellars. The Duke and Duchess of Connaught literally showered gifts upon them. Pieces of antique furniture were their joint presents and from the Duchess to her lady-in-waiting a check and a pair of diamond earrings, Prince Arthur of Connaught and Princess Patricia gave furniture and a piece of plate.

The numerous presents from Canada included a set of silver dishes from the Duke of Connaught's staff, and from the brother officers of the bridegroom a canteen of silver. The servants at Government House, Ottawa, and the public works employees on the estate sent a silver salver. 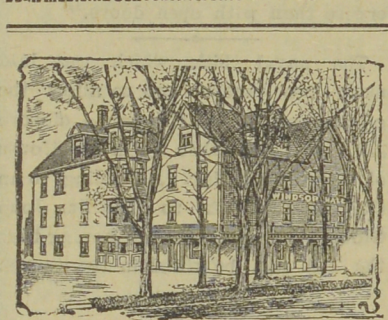

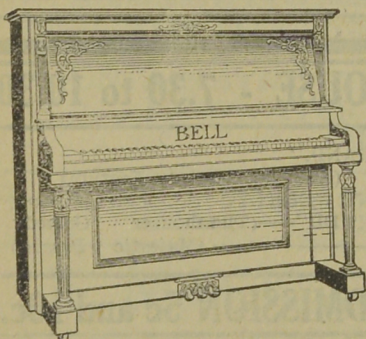
