BIG FIRE IN MONCTON

Moncton, May 6-About 1:30 this morning fire was discovered in Victoria rink, which was all ablaze, and at 2 o'clock was totally destroyed. At a later hour the Baptist Brotherhood hall was on fire as well as the Baptist church and parsonage, while the Knights of Columbus hall, Methodist church and other buildings were threatened.

Cinders carried a long distance and set many roof fires, but these were extinguished by ladder and bucket

As the Victoria rink has not been occupied for some time the fire mus have been of incendiary origin, o possibly set by tramps.

At 2:15 a.m. the Baptist church is a total loss and the Methodist church is on fire. Cinders flying in all direc tions and incipient fires are on doz ens of roofs, but it is hoped to pre vent further spread of flames. loss will exceed \$50,000. ance cannot be learned.
