FINDS STORY OF FIRST MAN ONLY A MYTH

(Toronto Globe)

Rev. Prof. George Jackson of Victoria University, who who is to leave Toronto on May 24 to assume his new duties at Didsbury College, Manchester, Eng., gave two notable dresses yesterday.

In the morning he preached the Victoria baccalaureate sermon at Convocation Hall taking for the theme the old and orthodox text, "The Just Shall Live by Faith." In the afternoon he addressed the Mens Bible Class at Sherbourne Street Methodist Church in the role of the higher critic, and provoked the wonder and at times the indignation of his audience.

In his address Prof. Jackson referred to the first eleven chapters of Genesis as "antiquarian lumber," and added "Why not throw them out?"

One of the audience jumped up and remarked rather warmly: "If you were born again you'd believe the Bible from lid to lid."

Discussion followed the address of the Professor and many there were who disagreed with the news of the noted divine.

SOME OF HIS STATEMENTS

Here are some of the things Dr. Jackson said during the course of his fifty-five minute address:

"The first eleven chapters of Genesis are antiquarian lumber. Why not throw them out?"

"As Abraham Lincoln said: 'You can fool all the people some of the time and some of the people all the time, but you can't fool all the people all the time.'

"We know nothing of the first man or of the origin of man."

"The first eleven chapters of Genesis have no scientific value. They have moral and spiritual worth."

In the matter of the application of The Prudential Insurance Company of America for the acquirement of its capital stock for the benefit of its policyholders.

Order fixing hearing on Application for Appointment of Appraisers.

It appearing to the Court that The Prudential Insurance Company of America has heretofore filed its duly verified petition, from which it appears that the said petitioner is a stock life insurance corporation, incorporated by the State of New Jersey and that the Board of Directors of said Company have determined that it would be conducive to the welfare of the corporation and in the interests of the policyholders thereof to change the corporation, from a stock life insurance corporation to a mutual life insurance corporation, and said corporation now applying to the Chancellor to appoint two or more disinterested persons to appraise the value of the capital stock of the said corporation and also to appoint one or more counsel to represent the policyholders before such appraisers and in such further proceedings as may be taken under or in pursuance of said petition

It is, therefore, on this twenty-second day of April, A.D. 1913, on motion of Edward D. Duffield, Solicitor of said petitioner, ORDERED that said application be heard by the Chancellor at the State House in the City of Trenton on the tenth day of June 1913, at ten thirty o'clock in the forenoon, or as soon thereafter as counsel can be heard, at which time and place the Chancellor will hear all parties in interest who may then appear.

It is further ordered that notice of such hearing shall be given to the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance of this State by serving a copy of this order upon him within fifteen days from the making thereof, and that notice of said application be given to the stockholders of said corporation by mailing a copy of this order to each of said stockholders at his post-office address, as the same appears upon the books of the said corporation, within fifteen days of the date hereof; and that notice of said application be given to the policyholders of the said corporation by publishing a copy of this order in one or more newspapers printed and published in the capital of each and every State of the United States in which the corporation does business, and in a newspaper printed and published in the cities of Edmonton, Alberta; Victoria, British Columbia; Winnipeg, Manitoba; Fredericton, New Brunswick; Halifax, Nova Scotia; Toronto, Ontario; Quebec, Quebec; and Regina, Saskatchewan, in the Dominion of Canada, once a week for at least four weeks, the first publication to be made within fifteen days from the date hereof. In case no newspaper is published in the capital of said States of the United States, then said publication may be made in a newspaper having a general circulation within said States.

and embellished old stories until poor earthly raiments became white and glistened, just as Shakespeare took the hemp of an old Italian yarn and with magic fingers wove it into a cloth of gold.

These narratives (the first eleven chapters of Genesis) weren't written until millenniums had passed and as there is no contemporary evidence of their authenticity, I cannot accept them as true.

"The first eleven chapters of Genesis are legendary."

"The creation and the flood narratives are reproductions of Jewish traditions."

"One chapter says Methuselah lived to be nine hundred and sixty-nine years old. Am I to believe that. Historical statements can only be accepted where there is historical evidence of their veracity."

"I do think Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Joseph were real men but I refuse to believe that they did and said what the Bible says they did and said, though I have no doubt of the substantial accuracy of the narratives."

"Hundreds of years elapsed after these men were on earth and the time the story of their doings was written. It is absolutely impossible to have accuracy in that event."

"Between Abraham who lived in 2000 B.C., and our earliest records of Abraham there was a period two hundred years longer than the period which separates us from the time of William the Conqueror. In the face of that can we call Genesis history?"

"The history of the Jews is full of uncertainties. We're completely in the dark concerning them."

"I don't want to disturb anybody. The man I want to talk to is the man who is disturbed already."

"Whether we're orthodox or heterodox matters little. It is what we are to Jesus and He to us that determines our standing in the Christian Church."

EVERYBODY STAYED

Before proceeding with his address Prof. Jackson said: "If what I say hurts you take your hats and quietly withdraw; I shall not be offended." Everybody stayed till the benediction.

At the conclusion of his address the Professor said he hoped no man would respect the first eleven chapters of Genesis less because of anything he had said.

Replying to a question many of which were raised by the audience, Rev. Mr. Jackson said there was no hint of a Trinity in the word "us" which appears in Genesis. The doctrine of the Trinity was essentially a New Testament doctrine. The plural in the Old Testament was due to unpurged polytheistic beliefs.

Questions were still being asked when the Chairman announced that the meeting must close.

The subject will be resumed next Sunday and will conclude on the following Sunday, as Prof. Jackson leaves on May 24th to assume his duties at Didsbury College, England

MARRIED A GRIT
LATEST TORY CHARGE

Ottawa, April 30—Because a woman married a Grit husband is evidently considered an act of offensive partisanship by the present Government, and a reason for her dismissal as Postmistress. A return tabled in the Commons lately, dealing with the change of postmistress at Whitney Pier, Cape Breton, shows that Mrs. Annie Gallivan, the Postmistress at the Pier, was dismissed last year on the recommendation of a defeated Conservative candidate, J. W. Madden, ex-M. P. The new appointee was Miss Minnie Carlin, a sister of Peter J. Carlin, an ex-postmaster, who applied for the position.

Mr. Madden, in his letter to the Postmaster General, says that the appointment of Miss Carlin would be the same thing as if Carlin himself were appointed, and he substantiates the statements made by the latter as to the reasons are given in two letters addressed to Premier Borden.

In Carlin's first letter he says: "The person who has the Postoffice her husband done all he could on election day to help the Liberal party, and also the people he employed are the strong Liberal party and after all I done for the Conservative party I think they should make my appointment."

In his second letter he says: "Mrs. Gallivan married a Grit. Mr. Gallivan, in endorsing, says that he is dwarf, but once a year or so when he goes on a jammeres, which is likely to last for a week or so, and which would not reflect credit upon the Department if the appointment was made out in his name."

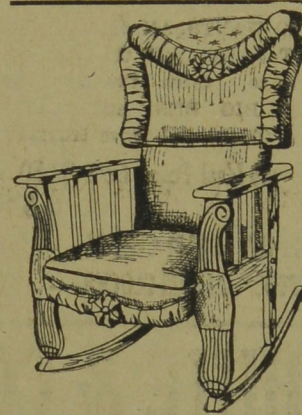
