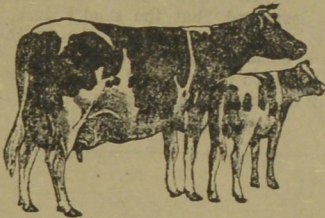

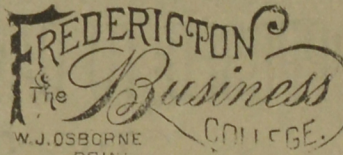

## McGUIRE WILL URGE

## INSANITY PLEA

White Plains, N. Y., Jan. 27.—John  
H. McGuire was arraigned for trial  
today on a charge of having murdered  
Sergeant Starrett of Rochelle  
Heights, on October 3rd last. Mc-  
Guire was employed by Mr. Starrett  
as butler for several months and was  
discharged. On the night of the  
murder he forced his way into the  
Starrett residence, and it is charged  
that he shot and killed Mr. Starrett  
while the latter was in bed.

It is expected that the defence will  
be based upon a plea of insanity.  
Ever since his arrest McGuire has  
acted in an irrational manner. His  
Attorney declares that he inherited  
insanity and it is expected and it is  
expected that his old mother, whose  
home is in Tennessee, will appear at  
the trial to testify in substantiation  
of the insanity plea. The prosecu-  
ting attorney, on the other hand, as-  
serts that the man is faking insanity.  
He has been examined by two  
eminent specialists, both of whom  
reported that he showed no symp-  
toms of insanity.

RESENTS SLURS ON  
UNITED STATES NAVY

Montreal, Jan. 27.—A Washington  
despatch to The Gazette says:

Great indignation has been created  
in Washington by the speech of Major  
"Sam" Sharpe in the House of Com-  
mons at Ottawa to the effect that  
"few native Americans sign for the  
navy," and that those who do are  
"desperate, no good socially, morally  
or otherwise," and, finally, that the  
navy becomes a home "for destitutes  
and moral degenerates, deserters  
from foreign ships."

The speech of Major Sharpe was  
the topic of conversation in the  
Army and Navy Club, where the  
members were vigorous in character-  
izing Major Sharpe as uninformed or  
else malicious. Admiral Dewey, hero  
of Manila Bay, took occasion to say  
that the men of the United States  
navy were of the highest character,  
morally and physically, and that  
they were a credit to the United  
States. He said that he had never  
met a finer body of men.

Rear Admiral Andrews, aide to  
the secretary of the navy and chief  
of the bureau of investigation, said  
that the charge that few native  
Americans enter the navy, except those  
who are desperate and morally unfit,  
and that the navy welcomes desert-  
ers from foreign fleets, is "unqualifi-  
ably untrue." It was pointed out  
here that the American navy has not  
for six years or more accepted re-  
cruits who were not American citi-  
zens, the few aliens still in the  
navy being limited to continuous ser-  
vice men who are permitted to re-  
enlist if qualified.

The report for the last fiscal year  
shows that 96.25 per cent. of all the  
men in the American navy were American  
citizens, and 90.20 per cent. of  
all the enlisted force were American  
born. No military service in the  
world maintains a higher standard  
than the United States navy. Last  
year 73,364 men made application  
for enlistment, and only 17,743 were  
enlisted, the percentage of acceptances  
having ranged in recent years  
between 18 and 24.

whole, General?"

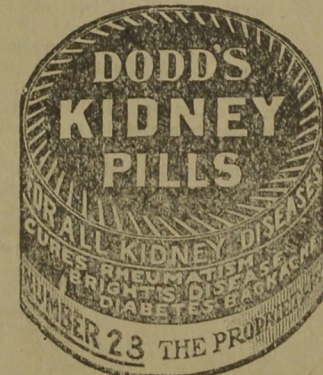
"Among the people as a whole?
