The pylon is crowned by a group representing Columbia triumphant, monument fifty-seven feet in eight. All the other sculptures are of Knoxville marble. In panels on the lateral faces of the shaft are incribed the names of those to whom he monument is dedicated.

At either side of the pylon and separated from it by two park roads are wo entrances formed by four garden ed by a low wall and with seats fac-ing the circle. The pylon itself and the houses and the wall are of Tennessee marble, with a granite base of a similar shade of color.
