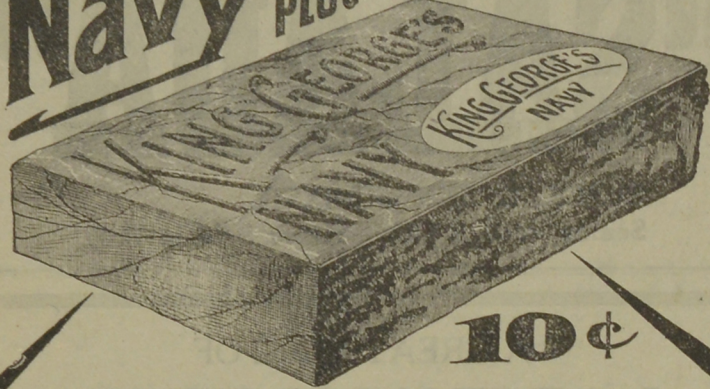

Immediately afterward Gibbons put a left hook to the jaw, and Perry went down and out.
