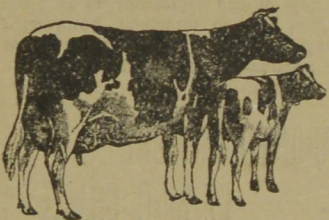

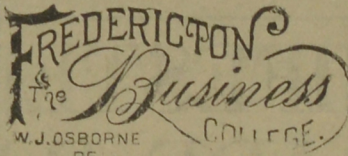

SHORT COURSES  
IN FRUIT GROWING

The provincial department of agriculture has arranged to hold a series of short courses in fruit growing, each of two days duration, as follows:

February 3 and 4, at Keswick Ridge.  
February 6 and 7, at Fredericton.  
February 10 and 11, at Burton.  
February 13 and 14, at Gagetown.  
February 24 and 25, at Central Hampstead.  
February 27 and 28, at Brown's Flats.  
March 4 and 5 at Moncton.

Short courses may also be held at one or two other places if demanded. The following program will be closely adhered to:

## FIRST DAY

9.00 a.m.—The Outlook for Fruit Growing, A. G. Turney.  
9.30 a.m.—Address on Box Packing of Apples, R. P. Gorham.  
20.00 to 12.00—Practical Work in Box Packing.  
2.00 to 5.00 p.m.—Practical Work in Box Packing.  
8.00 p.m.—The Fruit Marks Act, S. L. Peters.  
8.45 p.m.—Insect and Fungus Pests of the Orchard and How to Control Them, R. P. Gorham.  
9.15 p.m.—The Selection of Nursery Stock and Planting of Orchards, A. G. Turney.

## SECOND DAY.

9.00 a.m.—Demonstration of Barrel Packing of Apples, S. L. Peters.  
10.00 to 12.00 a.m.—Practical Work in Box and Barrel Packing.  
2.00 to 5.00 p.m.—Practical Work in Pruning in Orchard (weather permitting) or Box Packing.  
8.00 to 10.00 p.m.—Question Draw and Discussion of Subjects as Desired by the Class.

Alterations in this program will be made to permit the discussion and treatment of other phases of fruit growing should the class so desire.

These courses will be in charge of A. G. Turney, provincial horticulturist, assisted by R. P. Gorham, assistant horticulturist, and S. L. Peters, dominion fruit inspector. Every effort will be made to render these courses as practical as possible and a large portion of the time will be devoted to practical work in box and barrel packing and pruning. It is to be hoped that the fruit growers in the district where these courses are to be held will show their appreciation of this interest in their behalf by attending in good numbers and co-operating with the instructors in making the movement successful.

CHICAGO TERRORIZED  
BY AUTO BANDITS

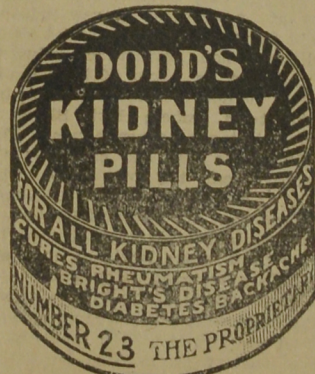
Chicago, Jan. 28.—Are you ready boys? Keep your fingers on the triggers and fire when you see the whites of their eyes or the tips of their coat tails! cheerfully directed Capt. John Jerry Halpin, chief of Chicago detective bureau. He was addressing the first squadron of 'bandit hounds' sent out to stop the automobile bandits who have made the latest Chicago crime wave more murderous than any before.

The 'bandit hounds' are recruited from the most fearless dare-devil sleuths on the pay-roll. Four auto squads patrol the streets from sunset to sunrise, armed with rifles and revolvers.

But the robberies and stick-ups go right along. Chicago papers have got into the habit of noting new cases like this: 'Auto bandit robbery No 18' and it is no unusual thing for the auto bandits to send their respects to the bandit hounds after a robbery.

There's a standing invitation from police headquarters to women have to go out alone at night, to call up and get a 'copper' to escort them. In many neighborhoods women are afraid to appear on the street alone after dark. Churches are complaining that the crime wave keeps women away from Sunday services, and the pastor of the First United Presbyterian Church last Sunday enrolled the one brawny member of the Bible Class in a 'strong-arm' squad to take the unescorted women and girls home.

One hundred detectives have been assigned to the 'clean-up' squad. They have been told to arrest the 10,000 crooks hanging out in Chicago on vagrancy charges.

## NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

The City of Fredericton will present at the approaching Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick the following bills for enactment:

(1) A Bill authorizing the City to grant certain concessions to the Palmer-McLellan Company, Limited, and to fix the valuation of the property of Frasers Limited in this City for taxation purposes.

(2) A Bill to authorize the issue of Debentures for the erection of a Fire Station, a Police Station, for the purchase of Queen's Park and for the further construction of Permanent Street Pavements, not exceeding in the whole the sum of Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000).

(3) A Bill to provide for lighting by electricity the Fredericton and St. Mary's Highway Bridge.
