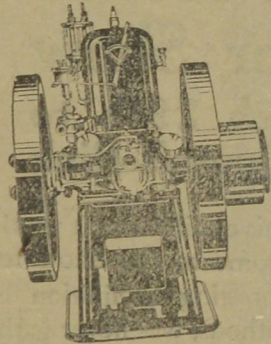

## Pets Nosed Marathons Out In Tenth Inning

Pete Condon Replaced Ahearn in Seventh Inning, Pitched Good Game and Batted in Winning Run in Tenth Inning--Game Full of Thrills--Ahearn in Bad With Fans--Crowd Displeased at Some Decisions of Umpire--St. Croix Won From Bangor

There was a ten-inning game full of thrills at Scully's Grove yesterday. Fredericton won 7 to 6 and Pete Condon proved the mgn of the hour, rapping out the single in the tenth that scored the winning run after pitching gilt-edged ball far three and one-third innings following Ahearn's efforts.

The game was not particularly classy but with its sea-sawing score and heavy hitting was interesting. If St. John's infield had not got careless at critical moments and had a little common sense been used by their coaches the result of the game would have been different. They started by scoring three runs in the first inning enough to win any ordinary game but the Pets made four in the sixth thus getting their chance to win.

The crowd did not take kindly to several of Umpire Keeler's decisions and it also thought little of Pitcher Ahearn's performance particularly in the first inning. As usual O'Brien the loquacious third sacker for St. John came in for a lot of ragging which continued in the street after the game was over.

St. John began the game as if they would wip hands down. Ahearn passed O'Brien, the first man up, and was hit safely by the next four men. Three runs resulted.

Fredericton scored one in the fourth, Bob Conley getting a three-base hit and scoring on White's single.

In the fifth St. John made another Waterhouse hitting safely, being sacrificed by Woodbury and scoring on O'Brien's hit.

In the sixth when the crowd were conceding the Greeks the game by a big margin the Pets took a new lease of life. They scored four runs, taking the lead by one run. In this inning Duggan was the first batter and fied out to O'Brien. Stone hit safely, White ran for him stealing second and taking third on Conley's sacrifice fly. Callahan drove out a three-bagger scoring White. The latter came to bat and was passed. He stole second. Murphy hit to Pinkerton who threw to Shankey only to have him drop the ball. Callahan and White both scored. Ahearn singled along the left foul line and Murphy scored the fourth and last run of the inning.

The game then grew interesting. The Greeks came back hard in the seventh making the score 6 to 5. Waterhouse and O'Brien scored two hits, a sacrifice hit and an error by Conley letting them do it. In the eighth Fredericton tied it again. Woodbury's heave over Shankey's head let Murphy reach first. A passed ball send him to second. Conlon hit safely and scored him. Both sides fied out in the ninth.

In the tenth O'Brien and Pinkerton were thrown out. Shankey drove the ball to deep right field for three bases. He should have been held at third but instead was coached in. The ball was relayed to the plate in time to catch him. For Fredericton Callahan led off with a single took second on Shankey's error and was sacrificed to third by Murphy. Condon picked out a good one and hit it to Pinkerton Callahan beating out the throw to the plate.

## "DUCKY" YOUNT PITCHING LEADER OF N. E. LEAGUE

Has Won Ten Out of Fourteen Games  
---Frank Harrington Has Won But Seven Out of Fifteen

Pitching records in the New England League fail to show the class of former years. The wonderful record made in the past few years by Ray Keating of the Highlanders, Marty O'Toole of the Pirates, Hugh Bedient of the Red Sox and a number of others are lacking. Most of the men who have pitched in a few games.

Perhaps the most notable showing is that of Yount of New Bedford. Pitching for a team that was in last place until Saturday, this young man won 10 of his 14 games, a record that would unquestionably be much better were he on a team in the first division. Bates of Worcester has won five of the six games, losing last week. Thomas of the same team and Luyster of Lawrence each lost a game last week and are tied with four victories in five games. Fuller and Pearson both of Lawrence are doing some good work, as is Anderson of Brockton who has won two-thirds of his games on a club in the second division.

Harrington of Lynn, who is reported to have him sold last week for \$4000, has won only seven of his 15 games. Van Dyke of Worcester, who was the leading pitcher two years ago, has won but five of his 13 games. Brignolia of Brockton and Griffith of the Whalers are pitchers who seem to have lost their grip this year.
