WORK ON NEW
DRAW-SPAN TO BE-
GIN IN NEAR FUTURE

Temporary Span Must be Rebuilt to Permit Work—Officials of Foundations, Limited, are in City Today

Foundations, Limited, the firm which has the contract for the construction of the pier of the draw-span of the Fredericton—St. Mary's highway bridge and of the supporting pier of the approach will have a crew of men at work this week or early next. It has been found necessary to remove a portion of the temporary span and to reconstruct it as the piling driven to support the flooring would be in the way of the derricks which will be used on the masonry construction. Carpenters will be at work in a few days reconstructing the false work.

Material for the reconstruction is now being awaited according to R. A. Armstrong local representative of Foundations limited. Part of the material for the coffer-dam is now here and engines, pumps, etc., are on their way from Montreal.

C. A. W. Bailey, manager for the firm, and R. E. Chadwick of the engineering staff are both here today registered at the Barker House. The work of reconstruction will be begun as soon as possible and will be carried on to completion.
