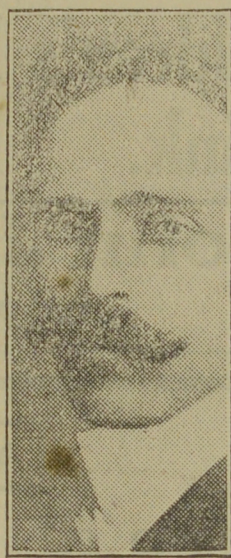

## MR. DAVISON A POWER IN BANKING

New York, June 13—"Friday the Thirteenth" has never failed to attract attention in Wall Street since Tom Lawson published his book of that title. But until today there never has been anything to justify attention bestowed on the date combining the hindoo Friday and the unlucky thirteen. Today, however, the street recalled the fact that it was the birthday of Henry Pomeroy Davison. In past years the birthday anniversary of Mr. Davison was not noticed. But the death of J. Pierpont Morgan brought about a change for Mr. Davison is now recognized as the most conspicuous figure in the house of Morgan—the man who furnishes the dynamic force of the great banking firm.

Mr. Davison is but forty-six years old. Twenty years ago he was a clerk in a bank at a salary of \$300 a year. That was in the town of Troy, Pa. A few years later he landed in New York and finally obtained a position in the Liberty National Bank. From the Liberty National he went to the First National Bank. His ability was quickly recognized by Mr. Morgan as soon as that astute financier came into contact with him. In the panicky days of 1907, when there were all-night conferences in the Morgan library, Mr. Davison was among those present. The next year, after the smoke had cleared away, the young banker was taken into the Morgan firm and soon assumed a position of leadership.

## PECULIAR CASE OF CHILD POISONING

Washington, D. C., June 14—Rear Admiral Hugo J. Osterhaus, until recently commander-in-chief of the Atlantic fleet, will be placed on the retired list tomorrow on account of age. Rear Admiral Osterhaus is one of the most conspicuous figures in the navy. He represents the second of three generations of the "fighting house of Osterhaus." His father was General Peter J. Osterhaus, who fought with great distinction from the beginning to the end of the civil war. His son is Lieutenant Hugo W. Osterhaus, U. S. N., who distinguished himself several years ago by leading a rescuing party in a launch which saved seven men from drowning at Norfolk, Va.

Rear Admiral Osterhaus was born in Belleville, Ill., in 1851, and graduated from the Naval Academy in 1870. Just before the war with Spain he was flag lieutenant on the staff of Rear Admiral Buncce, commander-in-chief of the North Atlantic fleet. During the war he served on the cruiser Prairie. His first command as captain was of the battleship Connecticut, which he commanded in the famous cruise around the world. He reached the rank of rear admiral in 1909 and shortly afterward was made commandant of the Navy Yard at Mare Island, Cal. His last conspicuous service was rendered as commander in chief of the Atlantic fleet during the great naval review in New York harbor last fall.

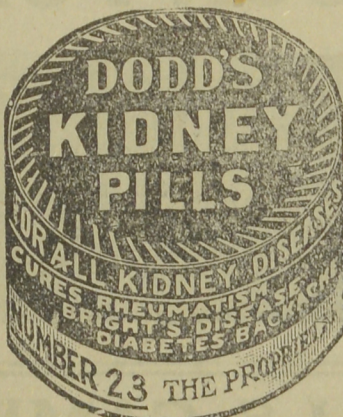

## ASK MORE FOR FREIGHT

Boston, Mass., June 12—At the invitation of the Boston Chamber of Commerce the presidents of three of the largest railroad systems of the East came to Boston today to present to New England shippers arguments in support of their plan for a slight general advance in freight rates. The three presidents were W. C. Brown of the New York Central, Samuel Rea of the Pennsylvania and Daniel Willard of the Baltimore and Ohio. It is the intention of the railroads to ask the Interstate Commerce Commission for authority to make a general 5 per cent. raise in freight rates in the territory east of the Mississippi River and north of the Baltimore and Ohio road. Before making the request to the commission the railroad executives hope to convince the shippers that the increased revenue is essential to the maintenance and prosperity of the roads.
