Steamer D. J. Purdy Returned to St. John From Oromocto Today—Work on Temporary Span Began this Morning

The steamer Hampstead owned by the Fredericton S. S. Company is to go on the Fredericton-Gagetown route in the latter part of next week. At present she is being overhauled at St. John. Capt. Flowers formerly of the Elains will be captain. The engineer will be W. Roberts formerly of the Victoria.

RETURNED TO ST. JOHN

The Steamer D. J. Purdy of the Crystal Stream Line which reached Oromocto on Monday on her first trip from St. John and which lay there for several days waiting for the ice-run to stop left for St. John at 8.30 this morning. Today however the run of ice has stopped almost entirely. Shore ice it was feared would interfere with the steamer which is a sidewheeler.

BRIDGE REPAIRS BEGIN.

APPEAL ARGUED
IN MACKINTOSH VS
BANK OF N. B.

Case Arising out of Defalcation of Manager of St. John Market Branch of Bank Before Supreme Court

The case of J. C. Mackintosh & Co vs the Bank of New Brunswick was argued before the Supreme Court this morning. Mr. H. A. Powell, K.C., for the plaintiff moved to set aside a verdict for the defendant and enter a verdict for the plaintiffs or for a new trial. Mr. M. G. Teed, K.C., and Mr. W. A. Ewing appeared for the defendant. All counsel were heard this morning and Mr. Powell concluded the case this afternoon.

The case arises out of an action brought against the Bank of New Brunswick by J. C. Mackintosh & Co., to recover the sum of \$10,000 for a cheque certified by Mr. H. B. Clark as manager of the St. John Market Branch of the Bank and al-

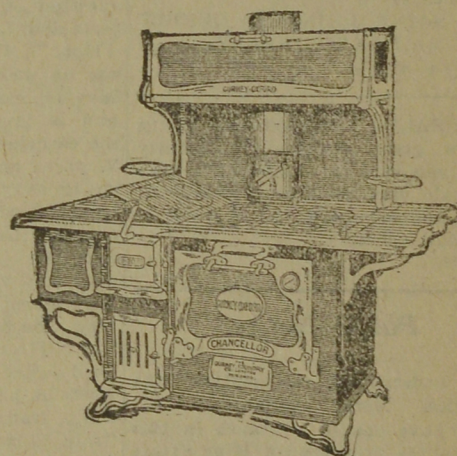
