TURKEY MAY TAKE A HAND

Constantinople, July 5—A semi-official statement declares that the government desires to maintain neutrality. It adds significantly that the conflict between the Balkan allies has aroused excitement in the Turkish army, "which it will be difficult for the government to check if Turkey does not obtain just and equitable recognition of her rights."

The opinion is general in influential Turkish quarters that Turkey should take prompt advantage of the present splendid opportunity to recover some of her lost territory.

DESPERATE BATTLE RAGING

Vienna, July 5—Desperate fighting has been in progress since yesterday near Veles, according to the Sofia correspondent of the Neue Freie Presse who says the Bulgarian troops repulsed the Serbian southern wing with heavy losses and expect to occupy Veles shortly.

The same correspondent telegraphs that a Greek battle extending over an area of fifty miles is being fought to the north of Saloniki, where 80,000 Greeks are opposed to 100,000 Bulgarians.

The Bulgarians since Monday last had made a number of minor attacks with the object of inducing the Greeks to take the offensive. The bait was taken and the battle was begun. The result is expected to be a deciding factor in the Greek and Bulgarian campaign.

The strategy of the Bulgarian commanders forced the Greeks to abandon several fortified positions near Saloniki, Langasa Lake and Reshik Lake.

The Greeks are now threatened by an outflanking attack from a column of 30,000 Bulgarians advancing from the south of Thynos Lake.

TURKEY TO REMAIN NEUTRAL

Vienna, July 5—It is announced here from an unofficial source that Turkey has agreed to remain neutral in the Balkan conflict in return for the concession made by Bulgaria in connection with war indemnity.

Stray Topics From Little Old N.Y.

New York, July 5—Everyone has heard the old joke about the English taking New York from the Dutch and the Jews taking it from the English. The Americans don't seem to figure in it at all. And, alas, this would seem to be pretty near to the truth. The figures show that of the 2,500,000 inhabitants of the Borough of Manhattan less than 15 per cent. are native whites of American parentage.

A palatial hospital for dumb animals is to be erected in this city by the Women's League for Animals. It will contain an operating room for dogs, padded cells for horses with blind stagers, apartments for sick cats, a kitchen for preparing special food for animal patients and a roof garden or paddock where animals recovering from sickness or operations may have the benefit of fresh air and sunshine.
