COL. SAM HUGHES AND SIR IAN HAMILTON VISITED CITY TODAY

Minister of Militia and Party Inspected
New Manoeuvre Area Near McGivney
---Left for St. John By Special
Train

The Minister of Militia, Colonel the Hon. Sam Hughes, Major General Sir Ian Hamilton and staff paid Fredericton a surprise visit this afternoon and after partaking of luncheon proceeded by their special train to St. John, where the St. John militia corps are to be inspected tonight. Fredericton has never been honored before by the presence at the same time of one of the most distinguished of British generals and the Canadian Minister of Militia. Sir Ian Hamilton is a veteran of the first Boer war of 1881 and also played an important part in the second Boer war and other campaigns.

Yesterday notice was received here that the ministerial party would inspect the proposed new manoeuvre area extending from McGivney to Cain's River. A party was organized and proceeded by special train to McGivney this morning to meet the minister. In the party were included O. S. Crockett, M. P., T. G. Loggie, Deputy Minister of Lands and Mines, Lt. Col. J. L. Marsh, Lt. Col. the Hon. H. F. McLeod, Major W. H. Gray, Dr. O. E. Moorehouse, M. P., John A. Young, M. P., Mayor W. S. Hooper, Ex-Mayor C. H. Thomas and Major S. F. A. Wainwright.

At the area which the province is to transfer to the Militia Department both parties left the train and inspected the land. The Minister and Sir Ian both expressed themselves as very much pleased with the area. Major Maddock, A. D. C. to Sir Ian caught a couple of fish in Cain's river which runs through the area.

The minister and his party and the local people arrived here at 1.30 p.m. and went to the Barker House, where luncheon was served. The band of the 71st York Regiment serenaded the party which left for St. John at 3.30. Motor cars were used to transport the party to and from the train.

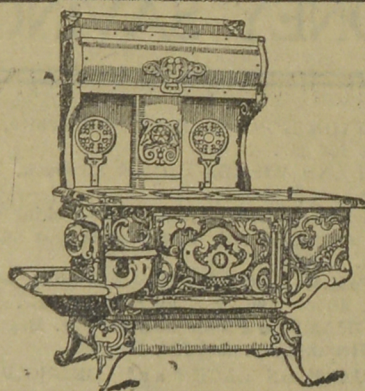
