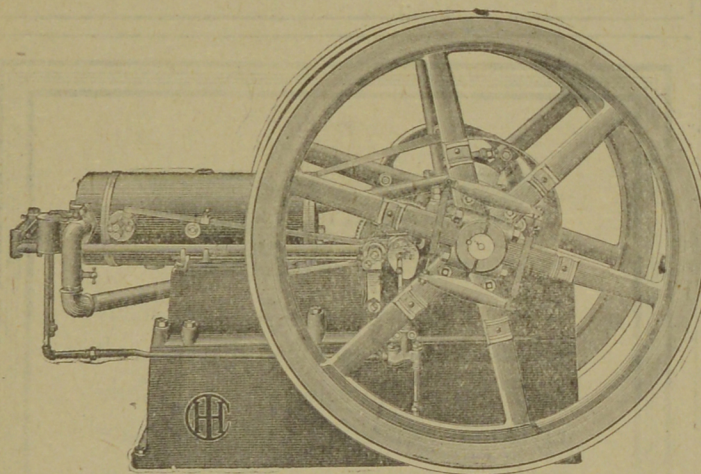

WANTS NOTHING UNDER
\$7,500 PER YEAR

Expects to Have Show Down With
Murphy Today---Threatens Suit
to Become Free Agent

Chicago, March 14—Jimmy Archer, holdout catcher of the Chicago National baseball came to the city today from Boone, Ia. He said he had made up his mind not to sign a contract that would not pay him \$7,500 a year. His reasons for the demand are that he considers himself the first catcher on the team by last year's showing. If Bresnahan is paid that much why should not he receive the same, he asks. He expects to have a showdown with Murphy Monday. If the \$7,500 is not forthcoming, he will bring suit to have the reserve rule knocked out and be a free agent.

ALLAN CUP MATCH

Edmonton Challengers Led 5 to 4 at
Half Time---Champions Won in
Second Half

Winnipeg, March 14—(Smarting under a reverse of a 5 to 4 score at half-time, the Winnipeggers spurred on by desperation, came through with a whirlwind rush in the last thirty minutes of play and by scoring five goals succeeded in defeating the challenging Eskimos from Edmonton, by 9 to 6, in the first game between the two teams for the possession of the Allan Cup at the Auditorium rink Saturday night, and won one of the most exciting hockey conflicts ever played in the west.
