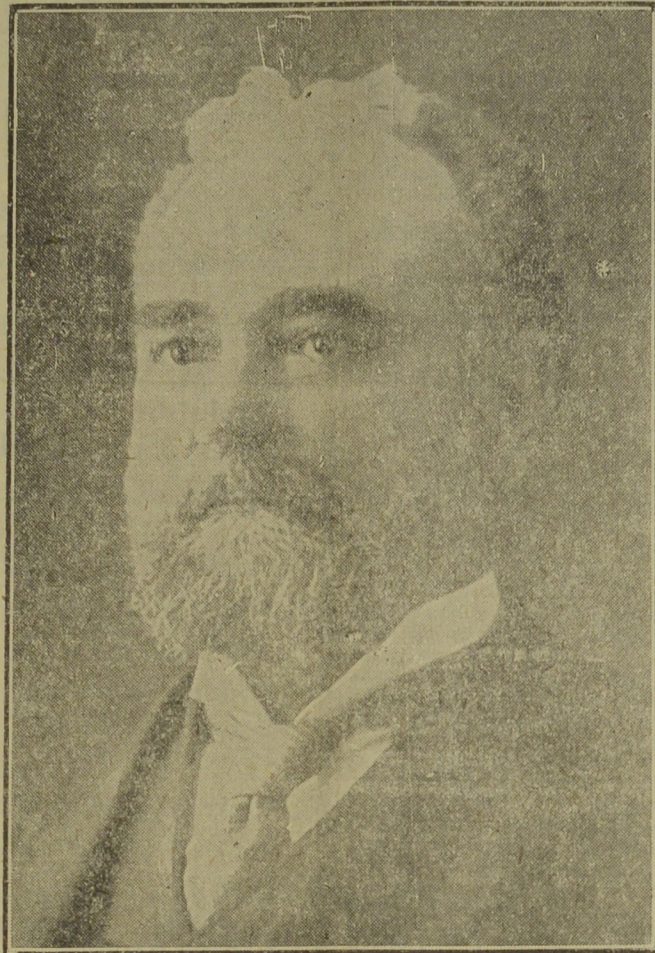

### CANADA MUST DEFEND PACIFIC AND ATLANTIC

London, March 12.—In the course of a speech before a meeting of the Royal Colonial Institute last night, Sir George Reid, High Commissioner for Australia made an interesting reference to the question of Imperial defence, expressing the opinion that the time is not far distant when Canada would have to undertake the defence of the North Pacific and North Atlantic, Australia and New Zealand safeguarding the South Pacific, while India must eventually take a substantial share in the naval defence of the east.

Such a scheme would leave Britain free to concentrate in the North Sea and a large proportion of the trade routes.

#### AUSTRALIAN EXAMPLE

Sir George thought that the Australian policy of having its own navy operating in conjunction with the British fleet was an example that must be eventually followed by all. He could suggest nothing better than the present system of Imperial conferences and consultations, with the Imperial Defence Committee open to the Dominions, and with freedom to the Dominions to share in the burden of defence either by having their own navies or by contributing to the British navy, a system which was consistent with the freedom of action and the co-operation of all the self-governing parts of the Empire. (Cheers.)

Speaking of the suggested establishment of an Imperial Parliament, with special reference to India, Sir George declared that while the idea was undoubtedly a noble one, he had many anxieties about it. Would this Parliament of the Empire, for instance, recognize the color line and leave out of the representation millions of the King's subjects? In regard to these Imperial questions some people were getting a little

#### PRESENT SYSTEM OF GOVERNMENT BEST

Let them have any good ideas for consideration, but in regard to the safety of the Empire he emphasized the belief that there would be a better development of the naval and military strength by proceeding on the present basis than by merging independent energies into one common Parliament.

Sir Joseph Ward said he agreed with Sir George that it was impossible that any self-governing Dominion would consent to return to the old system of government under a central authority.

Earl Brassey gave the assurance that so far as the Empire's naval defences were concerned there was nothing to be afraid of at the present moment. Indeed he felt justified in repeating Lord Fisher's assurance that they might "sleep peacefully in their beds."

#### Hawaiian Team Coming

Honolulu, March 17.—The baseball team of the Chinese University of Hawaii will sail tomorrow for San Francisco, to begin a tour of the United States. After a few coast matches, the team will go east, ending its schedule with a series of games with New England colleges the latter part of June. The tour will comprise approximately 50,000 miles. The party will include fifteen players and will be in charge of Captain Akana. Nearly all of the players were members of the team which made a similar tour of the United States last year.

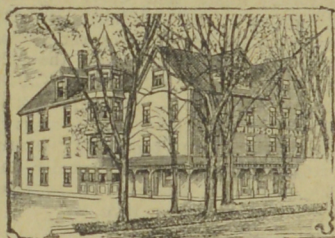
