BANKS HAVE SET THE SAFETY VALVE

(Montreal Telegraph)
"We are quite aware that there are some banks that are mere 'shaving shops'; but the bulk of the banking business of Canada is in the hands of long-sighted and experienced financial experts, who can see a coming storm as far as most people. They hold their jobs because they are not fool-hardy speculators; and it is only proper financing and good business for them today—when they find their disregarded warnings have come only too true—to refuse to continue to support some of the speculative movements which serve no public purpose and only seek to pocket ravished public assets."

These bankers, as a rule, are marked by mature judgment; and when they set the safety valve at a lower point than suits the game of some speculators, they are simply carrying out well established rules—rules quite as much in the interest of the general community and sound business as of the banks themselves.

There is, in fact, no lack of money for legitimate trade, whether mercantile or industrial. The safe and sane businesses are going on their way, enjoying the confidence of their bankers and providing for the country that firm basis of progress which is the only commercial foundation on which it is safe to build. "With these men, the banks are co-operating and they should not be attacked for declining to finance any more of the brazen gambling which has already worked enough harm to legitimate Canadian securities and enterprises."

That some of the "plungers," who are being checked in the interest of us all, are trying to raise a cry against the banks, is really the best certificate of good conduct for the banks. We can well judge a sound financial institution by the enemies it makes. And we can judge the status and purposes of the "enemies" by their violent antagonism to sound institutions and sound public policy.

The tightening of the reins at which these men grumble, will prove the salvation of the country. We shall have some public assets left—some natural resources unappropriated. We will find that legitimate securities will get a better reception on the money markets when the "hot air" variety have been punctured and allowed to collapse. We will find that real business progress will come to the front once more when the circus methods of the speculating ring have ceased to fill the arena. And it is on real business progress that all our

HON. MR. PUGSLEY ON MARITIME REPRESENTATION

(Montreal Gazette.)
Hon. William Pugsley, M.P. for St. John, N.B., and minister of public works in the Laurier administration, who was at the Windsor yesterday, stated that he thought the representation of the three lower provinces should be allowed to remain as it was when those provinces entered confederation.

Dr. Pugsley was referring to the coming conference of the local premiers, which has apparently been agreed to by Sir James Whitney and Sir Lomer Gouin. He said it would be generous on the part of the larger provinces if a re-arrangement could be made whereby the representation possessed by Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island when the three provinces were merged into the confederation should be retained. Dr. Pugsley stated that the premier had stated last session that the government were considering the matter but he did not know that any decision had yet been reached by the powers that be at Ottawa. Hon. Mr. Pugsley was of the opinion that a generous treatment of the smaller provinces in the matter of representation would be generally approved of.
