HIGHLANDERS RECALL SHEARS FROM BROCKTON

Brockton, Aug. 5.—President John W. McCue of the Brockton New England League Club, announced tonight that George Shears, a pitcher, has been recalled by the New York Highlanders and will be turned over to them early in September, at the close of the New England League season.

Despite his poor record so far as victories are concerned, Shears is one of the best pitchers in the league. Playing on a team well down in the second division, he has won eight games and lost sixteen. Seven of his defeats were by one run and four by two. He was batted hard in only four or five games during the season. He is more than six feet tall and is a left-hander with plenty of speed and good nerves.

Hugh Duffy, owner and manager of the Portland club, made an offer of \$3000 for Fred Anderson, a pitcher, and Paul Howard, outfielder, but Pres. McCue declined the offer. He expects to sell the players for a larger sum. Bobby Lowe, scout for Detroit is said to be ready to make an offer.
