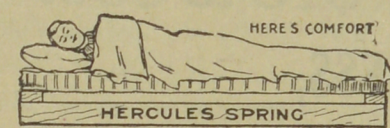

the present meeting is the Rev. Dr. David J. Burrell, of New York, a member of the Dutch Reformed Church. The Rev. Dr. George D. Matthews, of the Presbyterian Church of England, is general secretary. The American secretary is the Rev. Dr. William H. Roberts, of Philadelphia, stated clerk of the Presbyterian General Assembly.

The general council is not a legislative body. Its work is to discuss church and religious questions. Probably the most important matter to be brought up at the present meeting is the proposition for a world conference on faith and order, which is being advocated by leading members of the Protestant Episcopal

Church, and to defray the expenses of which the late J. Pierpont Morgan of New York gave \$100,000. Dr. Roberts of Philadelphia will present the proposition to the general council.
