Hanson and J. C. Hartley appeared for the crown and Col. H. H. McLean and Mr. F. R. Taylor for the companies. The witnesses who testified included Messrs. Archie Fraser, Donald Fraser and A. E. Hanson, the latter being called by the government to give expert testimony. One witness for the company gave it as his opinion that the company's land expropriated for the N.T.R., was worth \$20 per acre. It also came out in evidence that the value of the pulp and hardwood lands of the company had been enhanced in value by the building of the railway.

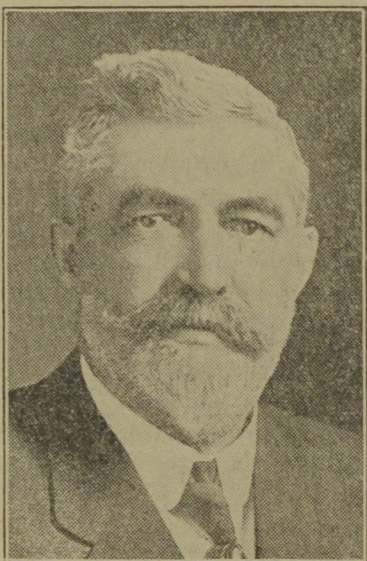

MOVEMENT ON FOOT  
TO HAVE POLICE  
MAGISTRATE RETIRED

Present City Council Understood to Have Matter Under Consideration ---Terms of Superannuation To be Decided

The proposed retirement of Lt. Col. J. L. Marsh, K. C., from the office of police magistrate and judge of the city court which he has held since 1871 is again to the fore and it is understood that the City Council considered the matter and will take some action. Several years ago the same matter was before the City Council of the day and the question of superannuation allowance for the magistrate on retirement proved an obstacle in the way of an agreement. The magistrate himself is willing to retire but has expressed the desire that his retiring allowance be an amount rather closely approaching his present salary.

Members of the City Council are not discussing the matter in any great extent but it is known that a

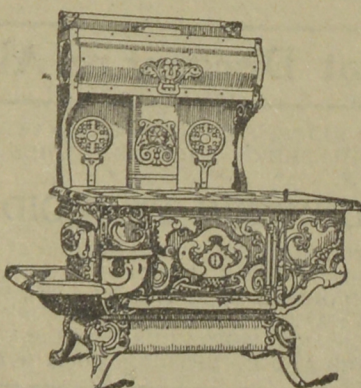

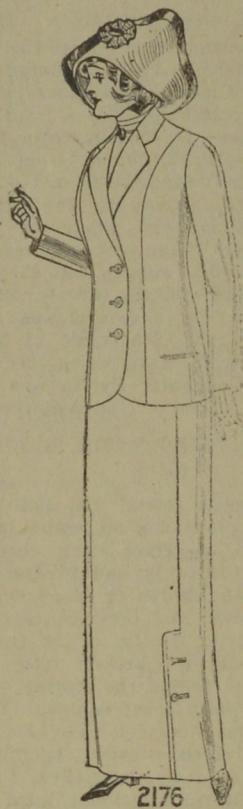
