

PROFIT SHARING PLAN

Chicago, Jan. 2-During the year of 1912 a total of several hundred thousand dollars had been distributto employes of Sears, Roebuck and Company, under the provisions of the profit-sharing plan put into efect by the company one year ago. Every person who has been in the concerns employ for five years had shared in the distribution to the extent of 5 per cent of his yearly' pay. check for the amount of the bonus presented to each employe on the anniversary of his employment and on each succeeding anniversary. About 7000 employes of the company have benefited by the plan during the first year of its operation and it is esti mated that within another two or three years the distributions will amount to haif a miliion dollars
