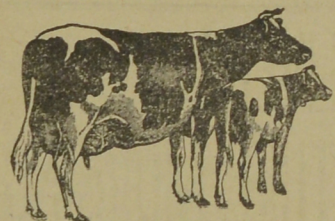

HOW GOVERNMENT MONEY IS WASTED ON THE ROADS

No Details in the Auditor General's Report Concerning the Expenditure of \$130,000---Sons, Brothers and Relatives of Secretaries of Highway Boards Usually Provided With Jobs---Amounts Expended in York and Sunbury

There is over one hundred and thirty thousand dollars charged to the secretaries of the highway boards in the public works report.

The province has handed over that much money to supplement the statute labor and the taxes paid by those who do no manual labor on the highways and by non-residents.

Some of this large amount of money is spent under the direction of the highway board, but much of it simply on the order of the secretary, who owes his appointment to his energy as a political worker and who must return the favor to the friends of his party by dividing up the money sent by the province among the faithful.

There's where politics injures roads.

The party man who gets the road money, in other words the highway secretary, passes the word that the member representing the county and supporting the government has arranged that about so much money will be "laid out" in his district. I he has plenty of sons or brothers or relatives, he sometimes forgets to give out the news, before he has given all of them jobs. Most of the men who do this work know where the money comes from and feel that in voting for their members and supporting their party they have earned some of it beforehand. They put in their time and a bill and the friendly secretary with a "lively sense of favors yet to come" passes it and forwards the account to the secretary of the board of works. The figures are checked by the officials here and the check is sent and the political worker is paid. That is how politics interfere with good roads. The men who say that no more than half the value is received for government money are right. In some cases that percentage of value is really too high. The good roads association should take some notice of the money that is wasted and endeavor to arrange so that the expenditure of all money spent upon the roads should be subject to the strictest scrutiny. Suppose, for example, that the highway secretary was instructed by the government to have his accounts typewritten, in triplicate, and posted in three places in the parish, showing every particular of how the money was spent, who will deny that he would be very careful how he handled the government funds? If he knew that all the people in the parish would be his financial critics and auditors, he would want to make the money go as far as possible and to get the most value for the road money.

How is it now? There is no publicity of the accounts of the highways boards. They are sent to Fredericton and filed away, the totals for each district appearing in the reports of the auditor general or the public works department. The highway board glances over the accounts, after the secretary has made them up, but in most cases they do not bother with what they consider is his work.

Here are some figures of money spent by the highway secretaries in the Counties of York and Sunbury. The reader must not be surprised if he sees the names of some who were not highway secretaries last year in this list. Their accounts are those in part of the previous year, included in those held over for payment after the close of the fiscal year.

The list includes the parish, the name of the secretary-treasurer and the amount of the account:

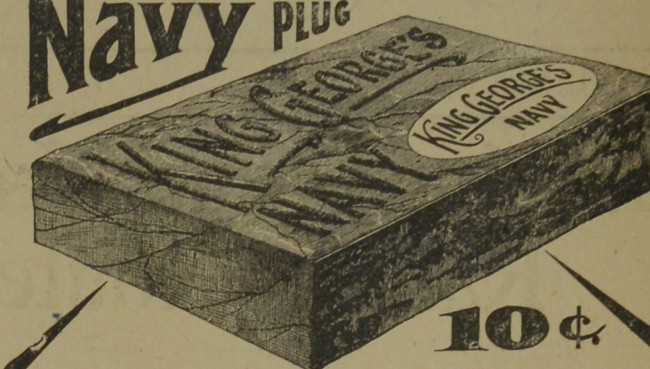
