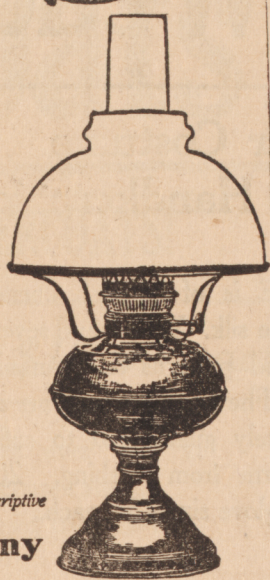

TERMINUS OF CANADA EASTERN BRANCH RY.

Chatham, N. B., Nov. 14.—Mr. W. B. Snowball, as president of the Board of Trade, wrote to Deputy Minister Campbell, regarding the Canada Eastern terminus question. Today he received the following reply:

Dear Sir:—I am in receipt of your letter dated the 3rd instant, enclosing clipping from the St. John Globe with reference to Newcastle being made the terminus of the Canada Eastern branch. Some suggestions have been made to the board of management that it would be well to abandon that section of the Canada Eastern from Chatham Junction to Blackville, carrying traffic by Derby Junction. Beyond going over the line and giving the matter some little thought nothing has been done. I can assure you that no change in this direction will be made without giving your Board of Trade and all parties interested, ample opportunity of expressing their views as to suggestions.

TORY POLITICIANS ARE PLAYING WITH FIRE

(Halifax Chronicle)

Opposition partisans who are cackling over the victory of the Bourassites in the recent bye-election do not seem to realize that they have been piling up trouble for themselves. In applauding the Bourassite propaganda they have been playing with fire, and they are likely to get severely scorched before very long. Indeed, it is now clear that the situation developed in Quebec is fraught with more embarrassment for the opposition than the Government. The Liberal Party will profit by the lesson of its reverse. It will not turn its ace from the same Canadian policy upon which it is embarked. It is able to deny that Quebec does not look with favor upon the rise of Imperialism. This fact cannot be blinked, and it will be the part and the duty of Liberal statesmen to demonstrate that the Canadian navy policy, while truly Imperial is also thoroughly Canadian, and that the proposals put forward by Sir Wilfrid are at once reasonable and in the best interests of Canada as a nation within the Empire. Quebec cannot be driven into the acceptance of this or that policy, but Quebec can be persuaded, and Quebec, we believe, will respond to the appeal of Sir Wilfrid Laurier. From the Liberal side the course of action is plain, but it is not so with the opposition. Already difficulties are multiplying, and faction is showing itself. Mr. Borden is in a dilemma. He cannot openly endorse Mr. Bourassa and he has not the courage if he has the will, to repudiate him. It is highly significant that Hon. Geo. E. Foster and Mr. Taylor, the deposed Chief Whip of the opposition, have wired Mr. Monk, "heartiest congratulations on your great fight and success." They are of the "Old Guard," marked for slaughter by the "reorganizers." Are they ready to join hands with the Bourassites? What else can it mean?

And on top of it all comes the startling announcement of Mr. Rodolphe Forget, the Conservative M. P. for Charlevoix, repudiating the leadership of Mr. Borden and calling upon him to resign. Mr. Forget is the money power of the Conservative party, and what he says, of course, counts. In a formal written statement, Mr. Forget declares that the "alliance between the Conservatives and Nationalists is not only un fait accompli; it is a fusion. If I were to tell you the truth I would tell you that the gentleman of the Nationalist party, with Mr. Bourassa at their head, are even more Conservative than I, who am the Conservative

member for Charlevoix in the Commons. I recall the words of Mr. Borden in the House of Commons, the leader of the opposition. "Those who have voted against me in the naval question have not felt the pulse of the Province of Quebec. They do not know now it is beating. Well, they know now how the pulse of Quebec is beating. Sir Wilfrid put his finger on that pulse, and so has Mr. Borden. That is why I consider that both of them have been defeated in Drummond and Arthabaska. I do not hesitate to go further and declare that Mr. Borden has no alternative but to resign if he has any hope that out to resign if he has any hope that suit of the next election!" This is the cold-blooded demand of one of the financial magnates of the Tory party. It introduces a new element in the revolt against Mr. Borden's leadership. The use of Bourassism portends ill for Mr. Borden. It may spell his political end. Mr. Borden has more to fear from Mr. Bourassa than Sir Wilfrid Laurier has. Playing the double action game with the Bourassites is indeed playing with fire.
