

Toronto, April 4—Justice Sutherland has reserved judgment on the application of William McComb for an injunction restraining H. H. Beck, general manager of the Anglo-American Insurance Company, from transferring to Percy Thomson, of St. John, for \$60,000, shares of the company's stock to the number of 3,612. McComb alleges that for this controlling interest he was to pay Beck \$25,000 and \$6,000 for his own stock. McComb says Manager Beck refused to give him the terms of his agreement with Thomson. He thinks that there is a plan to upset his own agreement.
