QUEBEC PROHIBITS THE EXPORT OF PULPWOOD

Firm Measure to Save Forests on Crown Lands---American Firms Seriously Affected by Decision---Increase also of 60 Per Cent on Stumpage---Takes Effect This Session.

Quebec, April 12.—Premier Gouin this afternoon announced in the house the new policy of the government as regards pulpwood. The premier said it had been decided to prohibit the exportation of all pulpwood cut on crown lands, before it was manufactured in Canada; secondly, to increase the stumpage dues by sixty per cent.; and thirdly, to increase the ground rent per square mile from \$3 to \$5.

This important announcement came at the end of a speech lasting two and a half hours, in reply to the criticisms of the leader of the opposition on the budget speech of the provincial treasurer.

In giving the reason for the delay in making the public announcement in the house, Premier Gouin said that it was well known there had been a threat of a tariff war between Canada and the United States. Such a war concerned the province indirectly, and the desire was not to embarrass the federal government though Ottawa had not asked for any delay. "However," declared Premier Gouin "it is the intention of this government to prohibit the exportation of pulpwood cut from the crown lands before it is manufactured in the province of Quebec in the same way as the prohibition applies in Ontario."

"We also intend to increase the stumpage dues, which have not been increased for ten years. The increase will be about sixty per cent. Finally, as regards the ground rent, the increase will be from \$3 to \$5 a square mile."

Subsequent to the meeting Premier

Gouin was asked when it was the intention of the government to stop the exportation of pulpwood. He replied that an order-in-council would be passed during the session.

Premier Gouin gave as an explanation for the prohibiting of exportation of the raw material, the example of Ontario, and indicated in an unmistakable manner that Quebec had decided to protect its own interests against the industry of American investors, who will, in the future, have to leave more of their money in the province if they want Quebec pulpwood.

HARD BLOW TO AMERICANS.

New York, April 12.—John Norris, chairman of the paper committee of the American Newspaper Publishers Association commenting on the situation in Quebec tonight said:

"This announcement by the Quebec premier precipitates a serious situation in the paper trade and tends to embarrass many paper mills which have supplies of pulpwood cut, but not yet delivered to the United States. The understanding was that any act of prohibition by the Quebec authorities would not take effect until September 1, 1910, but it is evident that some developments on the American side have provoked the provincial authorities to immediate action. It was understood that some negotiations between Canada and the United States would occur as soon as the dominion parliament adjourned, probably in May, when Mr. Fielding would be free to take up the matter with the American authorities."

BRITAIN IS UNDECIDED RE CABLE RATES

British Government Not Quite Ready to Follow Canada's Lead in Regulating Charges

London, April 12.—In the commons today, referring to the passing of the cable rates control bill at Ottawa, the post-master-general informed Harry Lawson that he was unable at present to make a statement regarding the course the British government would take.

Presenting certificates to students at the Crystal Palace Engineering School today, Sir Charles Rivers Wilson said there was room for thousands of competent engineers in Canada.

The imperial pioneers, including Mr Mulloy, who is commissioned to state the case for imperial preference from the viewpoint of the dominions, opened their campaign before a fairly good audience at Walworth. They had a mixed reception.

Mr. Mulloy said he would not continue in the movement if he believed it was not in the interests of the workmen. Interrupted by a remark that he was attacking the government's fiscal policy, he answered that the empire was above party.

The West India commission's report states that the recent tariff agreement between Canada and the United States should remove the fears of Jamaica, Trinidad, Grenada and Dominica that the United States would retaliate if a preferential arrangement were made with Canada.

The Western Canada Land issue is greatly oversubscribed.

Two women owning £2,000, called at the C. P. R. offices yesterday desiring to take up a quarter section in South Alberta.

Marconi's assistant manager says that in a few days the company will accept messages of direct transmission to Canada.

There is also a movement afoot among numerous German agricultural colonists for despatch of a pioneer party of young sturdy emigrants to Canada in 1911.

COEDUCATION FAILS AT TUFTS COLLEGE

Institution Will Cease to be Coeducational at End of Term--Separate College for Women.

Medford, Mass., April 12.—By a vote of the trustees of the institution today Tufts College ceased to be a co-educational institution. As soon as the necessary changes can be made in the charter of the institution, a new college, to be known as the Jackson College for Women, will be established. Until the necessary charter changes can be brought about, the women will be taken care of as a separate department of Tufts College.

The action of the trustees was taken at the close of a lengthy and interesting meeting at the college this afternoon, when the trustees adopted the report of a committee that had been appointed to investigate the question of segregating the sexes and which recommended that such segregation be made.

The balance of the college year will see no change in existing conditions at Tufts College. When the fall term opens, however, the women's department will be in operation and later a separate college for women will be established. This institution will have separate officers and a separate faculty, although it is expected that many of the members of the teaching staff at Tufts College will also belong to the faculty of the Jackson College for Women.

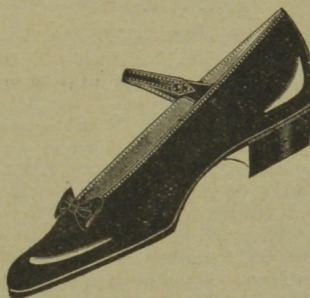
