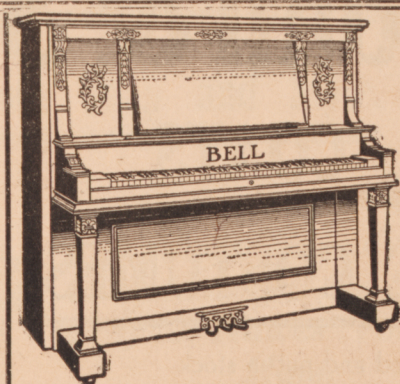

## RICH FIND OF GEMS IN MAINE

Geological Formation Promises More

Auburn, Me., Sept. 14.—By a single blast of dynamite, Forest L. Havey of No. 35 Ash street, Lewiston, has acquired a fortune. A mining expert of many years' experience in the various parts of the country. Mr. Havey was mining feldspar on the old David Brown farm, in the town of Poland. An excavation to a depth of about twelve feet under the surface of the ground had been made when a hard, crust-like layer was encountered. A hole was drilled and a charge of dynamite inserted. The explosion lifted the crust-like cover of a basin shaped depression in solid rock.

This basin was filled with layers of green gem tourmaline. Experts estimate the amount of the single pocket at 6,000 carats. This quality of gem is worth from \$15 to \$25 a carat. Thus it will be seen that the gems uncovered by a single blast of dynamite are worth from \$100,000 to \$150,000.

The rich find was as much of a surprise to Mr. Havey as to anyone. He was mining feldspar and the thought of finding tourmaline of rare quality and quantity had never entered his head. The gems are of unusually clear quality and free from flaws. The smallest will cut at least 10 carats, while the largest will cut as high as 50 carats. Already many of the gems have been sold in the rough, several having been purchased by the Rickers of Poland Spring House. Several of the guests at the summer hotel have secured one or more of the gems or souvenirs.

The discovery is attracting much attention among mining experts. Only a few days ago, while the Auburn Water Works department was blasting in Gamage Avenue preparatory to laying a new water main, a valuable piece of beryl was found and the blast revealed what appeared to be a rich vein of this valuable mineral.

## LINER MAKES PERILOUS TRIP

Crew Fought Flames For Twelve Days

Havre, France, September 14.—The Californie of the Compagnie Generale Transatlantique arrived from New York, yesterday with a fire which her crew had fought for twelve days still burning in her hold. The crew was almost exhausted and called upon the city premen to finish the job. The latter proceeded to flood the ship and have some hope of saving part of the cargo.

The steamer with sixteen passengers on board sailed from New York on August 27 with a load of merchandise. The first sign of trouble was on September 1 when a puff of smoke from the hatchway gave warning. From the time of the discovery of the flames until the vessel reached Havre her sailors had little rest, but they were, however, successful in confining the flames to the hold.

## GET MANY DROVE SHARP BARGAIN

London, Sept. 14.—A telegram from Salonik throws new light on the recent purchase by Turkey of two antiquated German battleships for \$45,000,000. It will be remembered that the Ottoman Government recently failed to recover the balance of ex-Sultan Abdul Hamid's fortune which was lying in German banks. German diplomacy proved more amenable than German law, and the Government accepted for the battleship \$40,000,000 of Abdul Hamid's money, which was practically in German possession, calling on the Ottoman exchequer only for the balance.

The transaction is highly pleasing to both parties. Turkey has been able to make use of the deposited Sultan's money while Germany has been able to sell two obsolete warships and to obtain prompt payment for them.

## PROVINCIAL PREMIERS TO MEET IN ST. JOHN

St. John, Sept. 14.—There will be a conference here tomorrow of the premiers of the maritime provinces and others to discuss the representation of the Maritime provinces in the federal parliament. As a result of the census of 1891 and 1901, these provinces lost members and there is a fear that next year's census will cut them out of at least five more, two each from New Brunswick and Nova Scotia and one from P.E. Island. The matter was brought up in parliament last winter and in the course of the discussion Sir Wilfrid Laurier declared the present representation is fixed by the British North America Act, and that to make a change it would be necessary to secure the consent of the provinces.

Hon. Mr. Hazard, premier of Prince Edward Island, Hon. Mr. McLean, acting premier, and Attorney General of Nova Scotia, and Mr. Warburton, M.P., of P. E. Island, are coming with Premier Hazen.

### THE DEATH OF A FAMOUS PROFESSOR

Boston, Mass., Sept. 14.—William Harmon Niles, professor of Geology at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and a widely known scientist, is dead here at the age of 72 years. He was a member of several scientific bodies and had contributed much to scientific literature.
