## POSTMASTER SUMMONED BY MILITARY AUTHORITIES

For Refusing to Allow an Employee to Attend Camp, and Subsequently Dismissing Him when He Attended Without Leave-Postmaster's Explanation.

Toronto, June 23.—An information has been laid in the Police Court against Postmaster W. B. Rogers by the friends of Sergeant Wm. McIntosh, who on Tuesday was dismissed from the employ of the postoffice for absenting himself from duty since June 6 without leave. During the period of his absence Mr. McIntosh was attending the Niagara Camp.

The case will be called in the Police Court tomorrow afternoon, and promises to excite considerable interest among local military men. The charge mentioned is "doing an act to the detriment of Wm. McIntosh." McIntosh's story is that he applied for leave to attend the camp, but this was refused though granted to eight other employees of the postoffice. Upon the advice of his company officer, Captain Clark, of the York Rangers, he absented himself from duty and attended camp. On Tuesday morning last he received a notice from the postmaster stating that his services were dispensed with. On the advice of Mr. T. C. Robinette K.C., the Police Court proceedings were instituted.

Interviewed by The Globe about the matter, Mr. Rogers stated that McIntosh was not in the permanent employ of the department but came on in April as a temporary clerk. "All permanent members of the department are allowed to absent themselves for military duties," said Mr. Rogers "and, in consequence, we have to take on extra help. McIntosh was not a permanent clerk, and therefore, not entitled to leave. His assistance was required in the office and I did not think it showed a proper interest in his work for him to absent himself without leave. As a temporary man on trial it is my duty to report on his efficiency and attention to duties. He was not reported for going to camp but for neglecting his duties. I have no authority to discharge employees, that rests with the department."

## ANOTHER TORY SCANDAL EXPOSED

Sir Wilfrid Laurier Contradicts the Story Told by Hon. Robert Rogers that Manitoba Judgeship was Bought for \$10,000—Only a Vile Election Yarn.

Ottawa, June 24.—The reckless and indefinite allegation made Monday by Hon. Robert Rogers, Minister of Public Works for Manitoba, that a judgeship has been offered for sale, is made the subject of a statement this morning by Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

In a despatch from Winnipeg to the Montreal Gazette, Mr. Rogers is reported as saying: "It is an open secret that no contract is ever let by the Dominion Government unless it carries with it a rake-off for the political fund. I was informed the other day that this condition of affairs is going further than even a rake-off of that kind. I was informed that when we had a vacant judgeship in this Province a very few months ago and when there was considerable delay as to whom should be appointed to this important position the delay was owing to the fact that a leading Liberal in this Province a man recognized as a trusted friend of Sir Wilfrid Laurier in this Province was trying to sell that judgeship for the sum of ten thousand dollars, claiming, as he did that the money was necessary to go into the campaign to defeat the Roblin Government in this Province."

### SIR WILFRID'S REPLY

The Prime Minister's statement is as follows:  
"The charge of rake-off on contracts we are familiar with, and can be set aside without comment, but an attack upon the honor of the judiciary is too serious to be allowed to go unchallenged. I do not believe that there is the slightest foundation for the assertion of Mr. Rogers, and as far as the Government may be concerned, I give it the most unqualified denial."

On behalf of the Government I add that if it were true that a judge had paid a single dollar to anyone in connection with his appointment that judge would not be fit to be on the bench and the charge, if true, would warrant impeachment.
