**PROGRESSIVE PARTY
GAINING IN SPAIN**

Premier to Continue Anti-Clerical Legislation.

Madrid Sept. 14.—Count Romanones, president of the Spanish chamber of deputies, is quoted in an interview today as declaring that the policies of Premier Canalejas are daily gaining adherents among the adversaries of the government as the country is convinced that he is working for the best interests of the nation. The Count thinks that Spain will be emancipated from "Papal Clericalism" which he says, has for centuries weighed heavily upon it. The struggle is not against Catholicism, but against clericalism which is impeding the industrial and commercial development of Spain and mingling in politics.

At the opening of the Cortes, Canalejas according to the president will announce an unmodified continuation of the religious programme. The "Padlooj Bill" prohibiting the creation of further religious establishments until the revision of the concordat has been completed. It is a definite law upon the subject which has been opposed by the Vatican. It will not be withdrawn but on the contrary the senate will resume its discussion of the proposed legislation.

**PRIMERARY ELECTIONS
IN NEW YORK**

New York, Sept. 14.—Yesterday was primary election day in New York City, enrolled voters of both Republican and Democratic parties choosing their delegates to the state and various other party constituencies and electing members of the county.

Chief interest centres in the Republican primaries because of the pending contest between "the old guard" and "progressive" factions in the state, the latter backed by Col. Roosevelt's former control of the state convention.

There has been warm contests in several Republican districts where the "old guard" leaders were trying to make good their threat to prevent the city sending to Saratoga a solid delegation to support Chairman Lloyd C. Griscom of the Republican County Committee and Col. Roosevelt in their fight. Indications today however were that not many of the proposed contests would be pushed to a finish it being reported to Chairman Griscom that the upstate leaders had small success in their attempts. The primary polls opened at 3 p. m. and closed at 9 p. m.

In Brooklyn a vigorous fight is being waged in several districts against state chairman Woodruff who is also the leader of Kings County and is allied with the "old guard" in upstate territory.

Tammany contests are over district leadership and the fever of partisanship runs high in not a few districts where the rule of the present leaders is being hotly disputed. In anticipation at the polls in such districts and in Republican districts where close contests are looked for acting Mayor Mitchell has ordered extraordinary police precautions.

FELL FROM MERRY-GO-ROUND; BADLY INJURED

St. John, Sept. 14.—The exhibition grounds was the scene of another accident last evening. This time, however, it was not so serious as that which cast a gloom over the grounds last Thursday. Joseph Masson, of Fairville, was the victim last evening. In addition to receiving a general shaking up he sustained internal injuries as a result of falling from the sea-wave motion merry-go-round. As a result of his fall, Masson was rendered unconscious and remained so until after he was taken to the hospital. He is said to be resting quite comfortably today.

ICED PEACHES

Pare and halve 6 large ripe peaches; boil 1 pint of sugar and 1 pint water until sirup snaps when dropped in cold water. Dip the halved peaches in to the sirup and set away in a buttered dish in the ice chest to harden. When hard, whip white of 4 eggs very stiff, beat 5 tablespoons powdered sugar into this and 2 tablespoons chopped nuts. Drop egg mixture in large spoonfuls into pan of boiling water, cook two minutes lift carefully with skimmer. Fill each peach halve. Keep cool.
