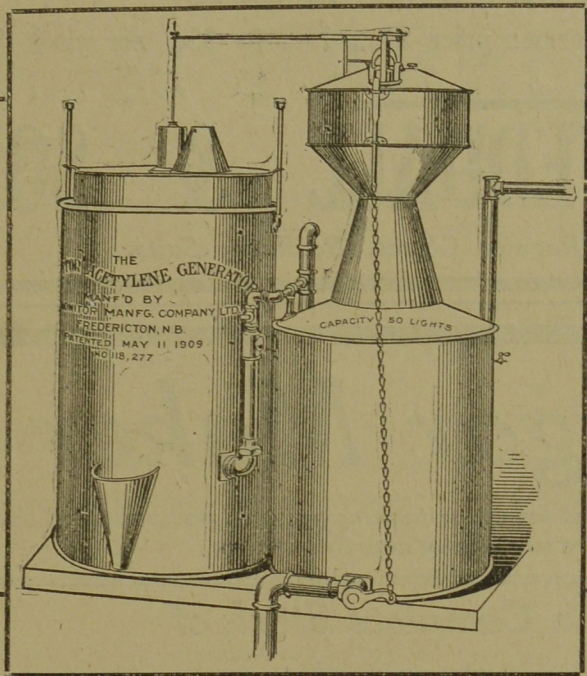

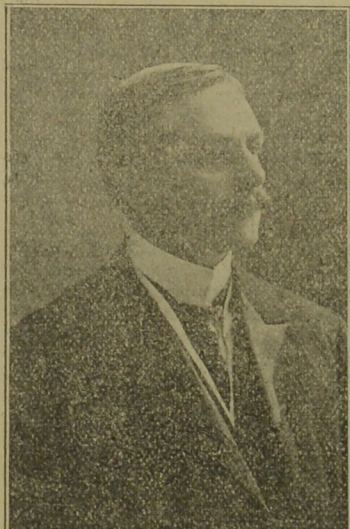

**GOOD GOVERNMENT TICKET
ELECTS SEVEN CANDIDATES**

Civic Election Results in Defeat of Old Council—Three of Old Council Returned—Ald-Elect Walker Leads Poll—Labor Men Take Part—C. H. Thomas, Mayor.

Yesterday's civic elections resulted not unexpectedly in a decisive victory for the civic good government ticket, of which seven candidates out of ten have been returned. The other three aldermen-elect were all members of the old council. The contest excited a great deal of interest, and brought out a large vote. Both sides were well organized, and worked hard. The victorious ticket, however, evidently had the better organization, and got its work in some time before election. The day passed off quietly, the only fireworks displayed being of the oratorical type, which were let off in the city council chamber after City Clerk McCready had declared the result of the election.

The excellent organization of the victorious side had much to do with the result, but another factor which had much to do with the defeat of certain candidates on the opposing ticket, was the attitude of organized labor in the city. Ald. Moore was the object of a great amount of attention from the labor unions, in some cases, however, the latter overreached themselves. A special ballot with Ald. Moore's name scratched out, was circulated among the union men, but some of them in their zeal neglected to scratch another candidate's name in St. Ann's Ward, with the result that as far as that Ward was concerned, their ballots were spoiled. A good many ballots marked in this way were found in No. 1 division at the City Hall.

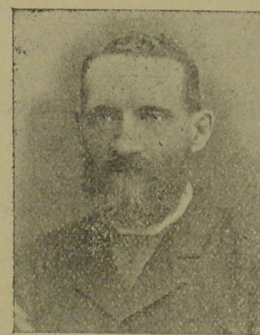
Although the new council will differ very much from the old in personnel, the new aldermen will not be lacking in experience for of the board of ten there will be only two who have not had experience at the board. Several were members of the council elected two years ago, but were left at home after the sweeping vote of last year. Alderman-elect Vanwart, who returns to the board after an absence of several years, has had considerable aldermanic experience.

Mr. C. H. Thomas was elected Mayor by acclamation. The figures of yesterday's contest follow. It is noticeable that the civic good government ticket made its great gains in No. 1 Division, which polled at City Hall.

Returned for St. Ann's Ward.

Following are short sketches of the men who will form the government of the city of Fredericton during the next year.

Mayor-elect C. H. Thomas is a native of St. John, but for years has made this city his home. He carries on a large business in clothing and gent's furnishings. He served as alderman for some years and is therefore not new to civic politics. A Conservative and a Methodist.

Ald. W. S. Hooper, returned for Wellington Ward, is a native of this city, and engaged in the insurance business. For some years he has been secretary of the Fredericton Agricultural Society and he is also secretary of the York Liberal Association. A Liberal and a Baptist.

Ald. elect John J. Weddall, elected for St. Ann's ward, was a member of the council during part of the year 1908. He is a native of Nova Scotia, but this city has been his home for many years. He is engaged in the dry goods trade. A Conservative and a Methodist.

Ald. elect Moses Mitchell is a native of the Parish of Bright, but has resided here for thirteen years. He is a contractor and builder and has had previous experience at the board. A Liberal and a Presbyterian.

Ald. elect A. H. Vanwart, elected as the colleague for Mr. Weddall, returns to civic politics after a respite of six years. He is a native of Prince William and does a large trade in coal, ice, flour, etc. A Liberal and a Baptist.

Ald. elect Joseph Walker of Carleton ward, who had the honor of leading the poll in the city, is a veteran in the civic political arena, having served as alderman on an off for twenty years. He carries on business as a merchant tailor. A Conservative and a Presbyterian.

Ald. elect Harry E. Harrison is a native of Margerville, and a son of the late Mr. Charles B. Harrison, who represented Margerville in the Legislature for many years. He is a member of the firm of Stanger & Harrison, merchant tailors. A Liberal and a Baptist.

Ald. elect W. J. Osborne, returned for Queen's ward, is a native of Belleville, Ont., but has resided here for upwards of fifteen years. He is principal of the Fredericton Business College and was at one time city auditor. In politics he is a Liberal, and in religion a Methodist.

Ald. H. C. Jewett, one of the three members of the old council returned, is a native of the Parish of Bright. He has carried on a grocery business here for many years and has been very successful as a breeder of horses. A Conservative and a Methodist.

Ald. elect W. G. Clark, elected in King's ward, is a native of the Parish of Southampton. He is not new to civic politics, having sat for both King's and Queen's wards on former occasions. He is a member of the firm of J. Clark & Son, dealers in farm implements and is also manager of the Lounsbury Company of Newcastle. He served as a director of the Peoples' Bank for several years prior to its absorption by the Bank of Montreal. A Liberal and a Baptist.

Ald. Hugh Calder re-elected for King's ward, is a native of this city. He is one of the largest property owners in the city, and carries on a general real estate and insurance business. He was city auditor for a number of years and is well informed on civic matters. A Liberal and a Presbyterian.

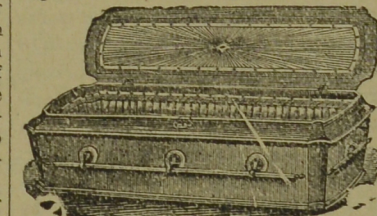
