DETECTIVE'S MURDERERS FACE JUSTICE

Rome, Sept. 17.—Three hundred members of the dreaded Camorra are under arrest, charged with being conspicuous in the plot that led to the murder of Lieut. Petrosino, head of the Italian branch of the New York Detective Bureau. They all will be placed on trial at Viterbo near Rome within a few days.

Enrico Alfano, head of the Neapolitan Camorra, according to circumstantial evidence unearthed by the Italian authorities is the man who planned, and under whose direction the New York police detective was slain in Palermo on March 12, 1909.

Equally strong and convincing is the evidence which points to Gaetano Gaudino, one of Alfano's trusted aids, as the man who, a short time before the assassination, sent a cipher message to Noto, Sicily, apprising a member of the Mafia that Petrosino intended to visit Palermo.

In 1906 Alfano eluded the surveillance under which he had been placed in Naples on account of the murder of which he was suspected, and the authorities decided that he had fled to New York, where he was captured by Petrosino in a raid on April 17, 1907, and turned over to the Italian Royal police.

That raid and Alfano's arrest settled Petrosino's fate. From that moment he was a marked man.

Early in 1907 Petrosino happened upon some information, which he thought would enable him to break up the whole of a secret blackmail society in New York. He sailed to Palermo, and there met his death.

At least 500 witnesses will be on hand to accuse the three hundred prisoners when they are brought to trial at Viterbo. To three men belongs the credit for revealing to the world the secrets of the Camorra in this case. They are Captain Fabrino and Maresillo Farris and Capezzuti, of the Carabinieri, a picked body of national military police. All are resolved that on account of activity of the three, the death edict be pronounced against them, and Capezzuti has announced his intention of seeking refuge as a monk as soon as the great trial is ended.

DETROIT RY. BEING SUE.

Detroit, Mich., September 16.—Corporation Counsel Hally to-day filed proceedings in the local courts to collect from the Detroit United rent due the city for the use of the streets for the company's street cars.

As the franchises expired the company was assessed first \$300 a day, and then \$500 pending the general settlement.

SPORTSMEN ENCOUNTERED VERY BAD ROADS

Boston Autoists Claim to Have Had Rough Trip Between Fredericton and Moncton.

Mrs. Andrew Kaul, Jr., and Miss Janet George of Boston, two of a party which comes year by year to New Brunswick for the deer and moose shooting on the Miramichi arrived in the city last evening from Fredericton, via Boiestown. Speaking with The Transcript, Miss George gave an interesting account of her trip through New Brunswick. They crossed the American line into the province at Houlton through Woodstock, down the St. John River Road to Fredericton thence to Moncton via Boiestown.

The roads, Miss George said through the upper part of the province were fairly good, but from Fredericton through to Moncton they were as she characterized them "simply awful." "We have toured Canada," Miss George said "from coast to coast and I consider the road from Fredericton to Moncton by way of Boiestown the worst we have yet encountered. In some places it was almost impassable."

MOOSEPATH TRACK MADE MONEY THIS SEASON

The owners of the Moosepath Driving Park, St. John, have not made so much money in years as this season, which has been an off year for other tracks. Not that the two running meetings were financial successes for the promoters, but the track received a stated sum for the rental of the same. Whether the runners will come to St. John again next year has not yet been decided, but if the present law continues in force another season they will be there for at least one meeting, unless they can find a more profitable place to fill out their dates, as to make the Montreal meeting a success the stables must be kept together, and tracks found for them to race on. After the past season's experience, the Moosepath management will no doubt be willing to lease the track to them again. They will also hold a harness meeting next year, if the American horses will come to the Provinces, as now seems most likely.
