

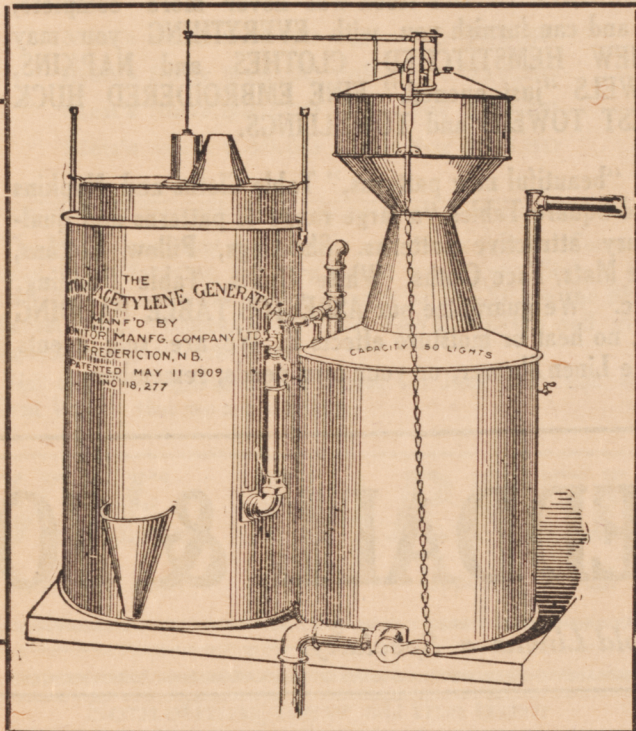

FROM HALIFAX

TO THE WEST

G. T. P. President States Third Route  
Will be Open by Fall for Transportation of Wheat.

Montreal, June 17—Mr. Charles M. Hays, president of the Grand Trunk and Grand Trunk Pacific Railways, before leaving yesterday on a flying visit to Winnipeg, to consult with General Manager Mr. E. J. Chamberlin, stated that there would be a third line connecting the head of the Great Lakes with St. John, and Halifax, furnishing a through line to the Atlantic Coast for wheat and other exports by the fall. Further, this would include communication by the Grand Trunk Pacific proper to Winnipeg and Edmonton. This will mean a great assistance in getting out the crop and an important addition to Canada's transportation system.

The line of the National Transcontinental between Moncton and Levis, said Mr. Hays is now approaching completion and it is expected that it will be finished this summer. In anticipation of that we are now negotiating for the running of trains through, over the Grand Trunk and other lines to the coast. They will connect at Levis with the completed line of the National Transcontinental and proceed to Moncton. There they will be transferred to the Intercolonial which will give them direct communication with St. John and Halifax.

'This will mean,' concluded Mr. Hays 'that by this fall there will be a third route from St. John and Halifax direct through to Montreal and Quebec, and thence to Montreal. Further this will of course include direct communication with the West, since at Montreal the trains will connect with the main system of the Grand Trunk through Ontario with its connecting steamship line over the Great Lakes and thence by the Grand Trunk Pacific proper to Winnipeg and Edmonton. It will mean a big step forward to the completion of the Transcontinental and the inauguration of a third route from the Great Lakes to the Atlantic seaboard. But as yet the connections with the far west will be only direct during the summer, when the lakes are open for navigation the rest awaiting the completion of the Transcontinental through to the west.'

It is also expected that the National Transcontinental will be open by this fall from Quebec to La Tuque when a local passenger service will be put on, and if necessary, a car ferry at Quebec to Levis. Through traffic this way, however, will not be possible until the main line of the National Transcontinental reaches Superior Junction where it will connect over the Grand Trunk Pacific with Winnipeg. It is not expected that this will be accomplished inside of two years.
