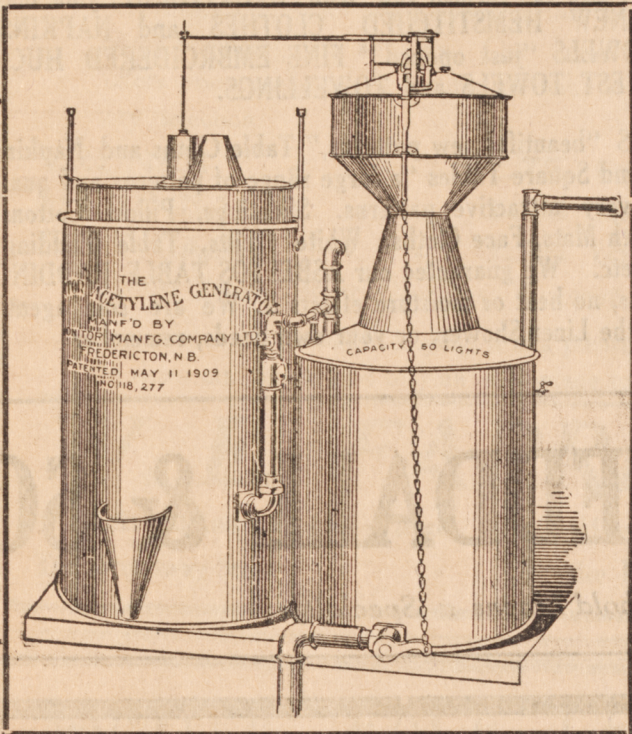

WEST EXPERIENCES TEMPERATURE OF NINETY DEGREES

Has Done Lot of Damage in Carnegie District; But Area Covered was Small—Garden Crops Destroyed and Grain Damaged.

Winnipeg, June 13—The whole west is covered by a great heat wave and crops are responding with phenomenal growth. At Winnipeg the thermometer was above eighty in the shade both on Saturday and Sunday. Several places in Saskatchewan report over 90. Watrous, on the G. T. P., with 92, being the highest heard from. The only adverse report is from Carnegie district; fourteen miles northwest of Brandon, where a terrific rain was followed by hail that lay two inches deep on the fields. Garden stuff was cut off at the ground and grain also damaged. The storm area was small.

MURDERER WAS THE ONLY WITNESS AGAINST HIMSELF

Edmonton, Alta., June 12.—William Oscar King was found guilty of the murder of Joseph H. Hindahl, near Ponoka, in March 1907, and sentenced to be hanged at Port Saskatchewan on July 21. King was the only witness for the defence.

It appears that King coveted farms Hindahl owned at Ponoka and in Minnesota. According to Mrs. Parks whom King claims as his wife, the two men left her house together and Hindahl was never again seen alive. Several articles of Hindahl's were subsequently traced to King, including a black team, which King sold a month after the tragedy.

Subsequently King when in trouble over the horse-stealing episode, took the police to a manure pile where the remains of the man were disinterred. The police were then unable to fasten the charge on the prisoner who was however, convicted of horse-stealing. Mounted Police then traced and hunted evidence until they got sufficient to justify the laying of the murder charge, which they have just pushed to a successful conclusion. A feature of the case is the fact that the prisoner fastened the charge on himself. King was very jaunty at the early stages of the trial, grew more thoughtful as the case proceeded, but heard the sentence unmoved.

FRENCH POLITICIAN ON BRITAIN'S POSITION

Says it is to the Interest of France that Britain Maintain Her Naval Supremacy and Increase Her Military Power.

Paris, June 13—Paul Deschanel, the well known politician and Past-President of the French Chamber of Deputies has just published in one volume, entitled "Hors des Frontieres," his speeches on foreign questions, delivered in the Lower House and elsewhere.

One address given last February, deals with Britain's position in the diplomatic world. The writer regards that country's strength as being closely connected with the maintenance of her institutions, and refuses to believe her people will be led astray by the cry for a single Chamber.

"I am quite easy as to what will happen to England," he says. "The mode of recruiting the House of Lords will certainly be modified, as everyone admits the necessity of a reform, and then it will gain in authority, because it will have popular roots. But as for a single Chamber, no. The admirable political sense of the English people will dispose of that."

"As Frenchmen, our interest, which is far above the tariff question, is the maintenance of the naval supremacy and the increase of the military power of Great Britain, because they are one of the most powerful guarantees of European independence. England's traditional policy has always consisted in opposing every power threatening European hegemony. Spain has seen something of this, and so did France in the time of Napoleon. In 1870 Europe committed a terrible mistake in allowing France to be crushed. She must commit no more such mistakes. The close union and the increasing power of France, England and Russia are the essential conditions of our security and of the world's peace."

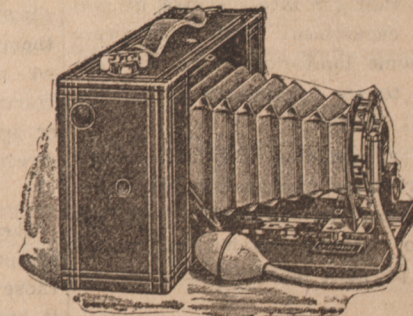
