BIG GOLD RECEIPTS AT U. S. ASSAY OFFICE

Seattle, Wn., Nov. 11.—More than ten million dollars worth of gold has been received by the U. S. Assay Office here since the first of the year, according to a statement by the assayer yesterday.

The total amount received from January 1 to November 8 from Alaska and British Columbia is given as \$10,507,621, of this amount \$9,309,109 came from Alaska; \$1,036,296 from British Columbia and \$97,021 from the Yukon territory. Other sources in Canada contributed \$64,994.

MAYOR NATHAN FLAYED BY THE VATICAN

Rome, Nov. 10.—The Observatore Romano, in an article inspired by the Vatican, comments on a letter written by Mayor Nathan in protest against the recent introduction in the Montreal common council of a resolution censuring his speech of Sept. 28 in which he attacked the papacy as an enemy of Italian progress.

The Observatore Romano remarks that while Mayor Nathan accuses the council of Montreal of over-stepping the limits of their civic prerogatives in censuring an official having no connection with them, did not he himself, over-step all limits of his civic authority when he condemned the Pope, with whom he has no connection?

"Nathan spoke as mayor," says the paper. "As such his insults against the Pope were detestable and arbitrary, far beyond those of which he complains. He passed judgment on papal acts and documents of which he was ignorant, for he is entirely without religious culture and is blinded by the hatred of the church—a hatred which holds sway in the lodges and synagogues from which he comes."

The paper ends by justifying the resolution of censure adopted by the Catholics of Montreal, on the ground that the Pope is universal and belongs to all countries.

CANADA CEMENT CUTS PRICES

(Montreal Herald)

Notwithstanding that Cement common has had an advance of about five points in the past three weeks and that thousands of shares have been bought by apparently strong interests, nobody seems to be able to actually locate the central point of the bull campaign. Some of the company's best financial friends, and its own head officials, are absolutely at sea regarding the recent extensive purchases which have certainly not been on public speculative account. The Herald asked Mr. F. P. Jones if he could throw some light on the reason for the great activity of the stock, but it was clear that he was not aware of the actual market situation. He stated, however, that much of the buying of the stock was no doubt inspired by the fact that the company is doing remarkably well and that its gross earnings are very much in excess of the gross of 1909.

A few days ago the company reduced the price of cement an average of about ten cents per barrel. This reduction was made on Nov. 1 and was intended to equalize prices in the different parts of Canada. To effect this a reduction of as much as 15 cts. was necessary in some cases, and in others a 5 cent reduction was sufficient. It is evident from this voluntary and unexpected reduction that the company has been able to effect economies to the manufacture and distribution of its product.

A strong feature in the Cement situation is the educational campaign conducted under Mr. Jones' management. This already has shown remarkable results judging by the number of enquiries received for the book entitled "What the farmer can do with cement."

The demand for cement has not nearly reached the point of productive capacity, though the fact that contractors now are able to depend on getting cement at reasonable prices, and at any time, should help the consumptive demand to a much greater extent than at present.

Although the future of the cement company is thoroughly assured, given a continuance of the present improvement in the business situation throughout Canada.
