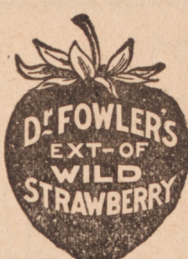

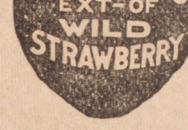

STEAMSHIP SERVICES AWAIT CONSIDERATION

Agreements Expire Shortly

Ottawa, September 12—The contract for the Rickford and Black steamship service from Halifax has just expired, but no action having reference to its renewal has been taken. The report of the West India Trade Commission is being awaited. While it has been forwarded to the Imperial Government, its contents, of course are known to Hon. Messrs. Fielding and Paterson and will be a subject for consideration by the Cabinet very shortly. The contract for the West Indies and South American service, the subsidy for which is paid jointly by the Canadian and Imperial Governments terminates next summer. As to what action is to be taken will depend very largely upon the character of the report which has been completed.

When evidence was taken here complaints against the existing service, the size, speed and accommodation of the boats were not lacking. It is anticipated that an improved service will be arranged for.

MYSTERIOUS FIND IN BRONX RIVER

Police Hunt Murder Clues

New York, Sept. 12—Because of the mysterious circumstances surrounding the finding of the body of John Collins of Haverstraw a deck hand, in the Bronx River early today, detectives are trying to locate the Captain and crew of the brick barge Ellen McGuire on which the dead was employed. One end of a rope found about the man's neck was attached to the pier, there was a deep gash about three inches long on the head, which the coroner says could not have been received by the body being knocked against the pier.

FRANCE TO TRY OUT AIR MACHINES IN WAR

Paris, Sept. 10—Intense interest attaches to the French army manoeuvres on the plains of Picardy this year, the brigade operations preliminaries to which have already begun at Grandvilliers because they will mark the first employment on a large scale of aeroplanes and dirigible balloons. Besides the regular military attaches accredited to foreign embassies and legations many army officers from European countries will be present.

Each of the opposing military commanders General Picard of the second army corps and General Maurand of the third army corps will have four air companies at their disposal while General Michael the director of the manoeuvres will have six machines. General Michael will maintain communication with the war department in Paris by wireless telegraph. In order to avoid accidents by collision between aeroplanes, they will be forbidden and their operations limited to scouting reconnoitering and acting as pilots for the dirigibles. Their fleet is now housed in specially constructed sheds at Grandvilliers.

U. S. SOLICITOR GENERAL DEAD

Boston, Mass., Sept. 9.—Solicitor General Lloyd W. Bowers of state department, died here at 11.30 a. m., today of complications arising from an attack of bronchitis. The solicitor general had been ill about two weeks.

Death came suddenly while Mr. Bowers was talking with his family. A blood clot in the heart caused almost instantaneous death.

Mrs. Bowers, a son and the nurse were present. The family has been staying at the Touraine Hotel in this city for a fortnight. The solicitor general was fifty-one years old.

DOMINION'S SPLENDID REVENUE SHOWING

Greatest Surplus in Country's History
Expenditure is Little in Excess of Last Year.

Ottawa, Sept. 12.—The statement of the dominion revenue and expenditure for August, and for the first five months of the current fiscal year, shows that the promise of "A vast surplus than has been" is being steadily borne out.

The total revenue for August was \$10,174,930, and for the five months, \$45,830,370, increases, respectively of \$1,705,082 and \$7,330,210.

If the same rate of increase is maintained for the balance of the year, this year's revenue will reach \$120,000,000, or nearly 918,000,000 more than last year.

The expenditure, on the other hand, shows comparatively little increase. For the five months the expenditure on consolidated funds account was \$27,546,017, or \$1,192,838 more than for the same period of last year, and \$18,284,352 less than the revenue. The expenditure on capital account for the five months totalled \$9,161,450, an increase of \$84,798, as compared with the corresponding period of last year.

The net debt of the Dominion at the end of the month was \$327,345,552, a decrease during the month of \$1,270,135.
