Toronto, Jan. 9 .- A bill will be introduced at the approaching session of the Ontario legislature, providing for the creation of office of public trustee on similar lines to the department and board in England in 1508. The public trustee would not only administer estates and trusts at actual cost, but would have power to step in where private executors or trust companies were suspected of mismanagement or mala iministration of trusts. The bill will be introduced by a private member but the government will be urged to accept lit as a government measure.
