ed the Robinson ministry and it is leaving undone the very things which it censured the old government for neglecting.

There has been an increase in the revenue of the province but the credit for producing it doesn't belong to this government. THE SCHOOL BOOK POLICY HAS CAUSED AN EVER INCREASING DEFICIT. LAST YEAR THE GOVERNMENT ADDED \$185,000 TO THE PUBLIC DEBT ON THEIR OWN ADMISSION WHILE, WHEN THEY WERE IN OPPOSITION, THE HON. GENTLEMEN OPPOSITE HAD PREACHED ABOUT THE PUBLIC DEBT MORE THAN ANY OTHER SUBJECT. They held it up as something to be alarmed about and unfairly declared the province to be on the eve of bankruptcy. They were hard in their condemnation of the old government and declared the debt to be in the vicinity of \$10,000,000, but after they went into power, the first statement they issued showed the net debt \$3,999,775 and the gross debt \$5,947,424. THE EYES OF THE PEOPLE HAD BEEN OPENED BY THAT STATEMENT, they saw that they had been deceived and in no one of the by-elections which had occurred

since then, had the government been able to elect a supporter.

The Provincial Secretary in his budget speech had declared that the net debt at the close of the last fiscal year amounted to \$4,402,547, but he had not told that THE GROSS DEBT AMOUNTED TO OVER \$6,200,000. WITH THE INCREASED REVENUE THE DEBT IS INCREASING AND THE EXPENDITURES ARE INCREASING IN THE FACE OF THIS GOVERNMENT'S PROMISES OF ECONOMY AND RETRENCHMENT. The President of the Council had assumed the role of a prophet and declared that the people of the province would send the leader of the Opposition back with only a corporal's guard when the opportunity arose for them to express their opinion at the poll and in answer to the hon. gentleman he would say that if the dissatisfaction now shown by the people is continued unless there should be a remarkable revulsion of feeling, the people would not forget THE UNFULFILLED PLEDGES AND BROKEN PROMISES OF THIS GOVERNMENT and the corporal's guard would be behind his friends opposite.

Mr. Byrne then moved the adjournment of the debate.

WILD WEST SHOW IN HOUSE OF COMMONS

Ottawa March 17—A furious quarrel distinguished today's proceedings of the House. Glen Campbell called Dr. Neely "a liar absolutely a liar" and refused to withdraw the epithet until the Deputy Speaker for the incident occurred in committee of supply, threatened to report him to the speaker. He then made a highly parliamentary withdrawal, coupled with the declaration that Dr. Neely dare not make outside the House the statement Dr. Neely was resenting. The accusation was a charge of corruption which Mr. Campbell denied explicitly.

The estimates of the Minister of the interior were under discussion and Mr. Campbell complained of the manner in which the officials of the department charged with the administration of Dominion lands discharged their trust.

Dr. Neely defended the officials and went on to address Mr. Campbell. "My hon. friend opposite, Mr. Campbell should not be too severe on the officials of the department or the department itself. It is known that my hon. friend has taken steps himself on certain occasions to lead officials to do what was not in the best interests of the country."

Mr. Campbell sprang to his feet in a blaze of anger and said, "My hon. friend is a liar, absolutely a liar."

The Deputy Speaker, Mr. MacIntyre demanded a withdrawal.

"I call him a liar and I refuse to take it back," said Mr. Campbell. "He had better talk of his honesty. Where is the capital of Saskatchewan
