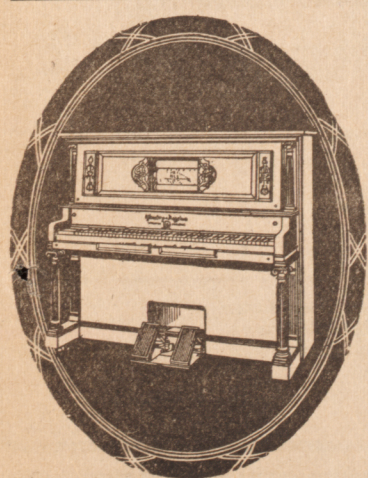

THE AUTO SITUATION IN NEW BRUNSWICK

St. John, N. B., March 18.—There are over one hundred automobiles owned in St. John. There are now three large garages of modern equipment, and the number of machines owned here is rapidly increasing. The president and secretary of the New Brunswick Automobile Association reside here. The former is Fred S. Crosby and the latter S. P. McCavour.

The St. John members of the Association have made some suggestions for changes in the law relating to automobiles, which will be considered at the present session of the Provincial Legislature. They suggest that the annual tax on cars range from \$8 to \$12 per annum, that each car carry a tail lamp, and front as well as rear number; also that the speed law be changed so that greater speed may be attained in the sparsely settled districts. The speed limit in St. John is five miles an hour less than in London or New York. It is also proposed that chauffeurs pay an annual tax of \$2. They are not taxed at present. It is also suggested that motor cycles pay an annual tax of \$2.

The New Brunswick Automobile Association has done something to encourage good roads by offering prizes for the best kept short section of country road in certain localities.

Last year the association by subscription placed an officer on the Woodstock-Houlton road for the summer season for the purpose of compelling United States motorists obey the New Brunswick laws. The association has a law within itself, imposing a fine upon any member who exceeds the speed limit, the information being laid and evidence being taken in the usual way as before a court. The association works in harmony with highway boards, and the Provincial Government, and do all possible to encourage road building. The Canadian built 40 h. p. car is preferred here, as the country around St. John is quite hilly.

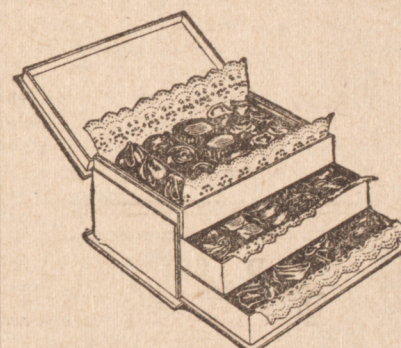
PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT OF MEXICAN TROUBLE

New York, Mar. 20.—Senor Jose Yves Limantour is on his way to Mexico City to assume the presidency of the Mexican government at least, according to Gustavo Madero, brother of the Mexican revolutionist, leader. The retirement of Diaz, Madero says, will pave the way to a peaceful settlement of the revolution, and the holding of a general election at which "a representative of the majority of all the voters" will be elected president.

Senor Limantour, the strong man of the Diaz government is to succeed his chief immediately as president his title being "provisional President." He will hold office until a real and true election is held, when regular candidates, nominated by conventions yet to be held, will take place. This is the only way to save Mexico. "Limantour is to be president only for a little while. Then the candidates will go before the people and after that a representative of the majority of all voters will be presented.

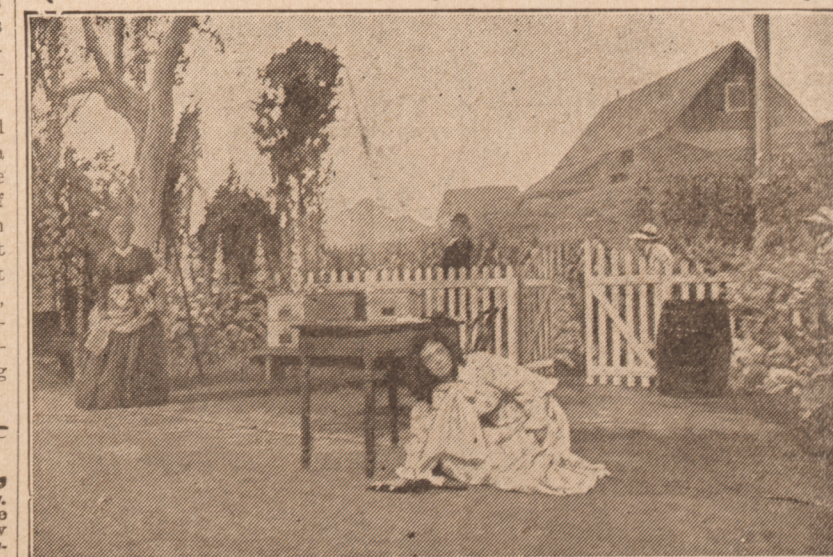
