The consus returns show that the population of New Brunswick increased by twenty thousand during the Quebec Bank, 5 @ 136. last decade. This is greater by ten thousand than the total increase for the two previous decades. Between 1881 and 1891 the population of New Brunswick increased by thirty seven 89%, 9 @ 89%. and between 1891 and 1901 the increase was 9000.

The population of Fredericton during the past ten years increased. ninety one souls. This is certainly a miserable showing for the capital city of New Brunswick and indicates very plain by that there is a screw lose somewhere.

The prairie province of Saskatchewan during the past decade increased its population from 91,279 to 459,574 yet at the recent election the people of that province did not vote to "let well enough alone."

The little province of Prince Edward Island suffered a loss of ten thousand 230%, 50 @ 230%. in its population during the past ten years.
