



### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over eigh teen years old, may homstead quarter section of available Domin on land in Manitoba, Saskatchewar or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties-Six months' residence upor and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his home stead on a farm of at least eighty acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son laughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader n good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his home stead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside upon the homestead or (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for purchased homestead in certain dis tricts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fift- acres ar erect a house worth \$300.00.
