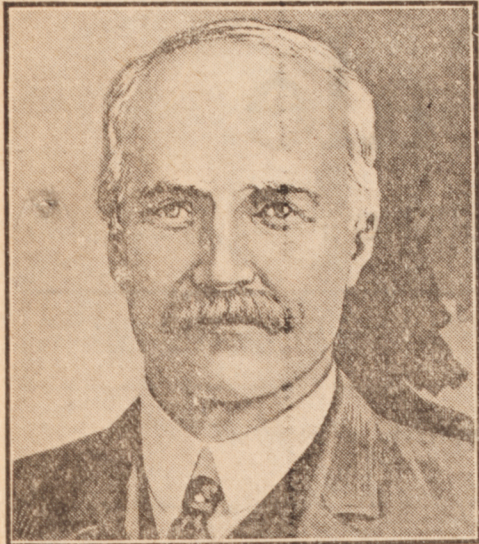

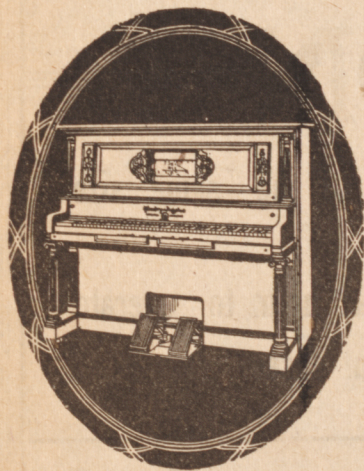

LOST CITIES DISCOVERED

German Scientist Claims to Have Found Traces in Africa

Berlin, Feb. 3.—Dr. Lee Frobenius claims to have discovered one of the lost cities of Atlantis of the ancients in Southern Nigeria. He is an Arlanic enthusiast, who has long been convinced that the lost Kingdom was not mythical, but was located in West Africa. Letters from Dr. Frobenius, who is in the West Africa bearing various dates in December and January, have been received by friends here, declaring that he has proved the correctness of his theory. He says:

"I have made an incredible discovery. I have found in West Africa traces of a high and extremely ancient urban civilization. I have found pillars, remains of granite figures, burned clay portraits of classic beauty and vessels and fragments of pottery, solidly overlaid with ungules of various colors. My chief discovery was a hollow bronze cast of a head covered with fine tattooing. I have thus proved in the broadest sense that my Atlantis theory is correct.

Dr. Frobenius makes a bitter attack on the local British officials who he asserts, seized his finds on the ground that the natives had stolen them and that it was illegal for unauthorized person to make excavations or remove ancient art works. They confiscated the bronze head and most of the other things, but Dr. Frobenius buried the clay heads. Learned men here withhold their opinions of the discoveries.

FAMOUS BOER GENERAL HAS PASSED AWAY

Millerksdorp, Transvaal, Feb. 4.—General Piet A. Cronje, the noted Boer general, who was captured by the Canadian regiment at Paardeberg in 1900 died today.

General Cronje was one of the greatest generals in the Boer Army and left his impress on the British troops in varied and severe engagements during the earlier stage of the war and in fact, until the battle of Paardeberg put an end to his career as a soldier.

Members of the first Canadian contingent who were at Paardeberg and saw Cronje after the Boers surrendered to the victorious Canadians, say that the noted leader was a man slightly under middle height wearing an enormous set of blackish brown whiskers. Though short he was heavily built and gave the impression of possessing much physical power and endurance qualities which his career showed he had in full measure.

He was also remarkably shrewd tactician and in his conduct of the western campaign inflicted severe losses upon the British troops. During the brief conflict in 1881 which ended in the defeat of the British at Majuba Hill, Cronje was in command of the Boers at one of the skirmishes which resulted disastrously for the Imperial troops.

PRIESTS MUST NOT MEDDLE IN POLITICS

(Montreal Witness.)

Archbishop Bruchesi, of Montreal; Bishop Emard, of Valleyfield, and Bishop Archambault, of Joliette, will issue strict orders to their priests and to all members of religious orders under their guidance, strictly to confine themselves in future to their call, and to the advice of the Holy See, by having nothing whatever to do with any political discussion, and by ceasing to show any preference to any political party or faction.

As already stated in The Witness, for weeks past a bitter controversy has been going on between French Liberal newspapers and Nationalists' organs, but the matter arrived at an acute stage on Thursday, when the Rev. Father Hermus Lalonde, S.J., took up the cudgels on behalf of the so-called Nationalist newspapers, and in a signed article in The Devoir, endeavored to justify the conduct of those who, while banishing from the colleges some of the French newspapers, tolerated and encouraged the reading of others.

The same evening, it is stated, the chief editor of a Montreal French paper was called to the Archbishop's palace, and, as Bishops Emard and Archambault, who had attending during the day a function at the Montreal College, had been forcibly detained here by the storm, the interference of some members of the clergy in politics was discussed at length, with a result that could not leave any doubt in the minds of those present.

The three dignitaries of the Catholic church will, it is said, issue forthwith strict orders to their clergy, advising those who have shown public preferences for any political party to refrain in future from doing so.

It is also stated that instructions will follow advising the heads and directors of colleges and educational institutions in the archdiocese of Montreal, and the diocese of Valleyfield and Joliette, that not only political, but all newspapers, are henceforth not to be read in the colleges, and that protection towards certain sheets must stop immediately.

Confronted, it is said, by the troubling problem which has been forced on them by recent occurrences, and the bitter controversy between some of the French newspapers, which has been going on for weeks, the three heads of the Catholic church mentioned saw nothing left but to call a halt to a state of things which had already gone too far, and which threatened, if allowed to continue, to strike a fatal blow at the prestige and influence of the Catholic clergy.

An editorial article which appears in The Canada of this morning, entitled, "Politics and the Clergy," emphasizes the contention that the church forbids expressly the unwarrantable interference of the clergy into matters of a purely political bearing.

The Canada, in the course of its article, adds that it has already received the testimony of competent authorities as to the occurrence it takes exception to—the clergy's interference in politics.

St. John Times.—Saturday next will be the 11th anniversary of the consecration of His Lordship Bishop Casey as Bishop of St. John. The ceremony was performed in the cathedral here and at the same time Bishop Barry was consecrated Bishop of Chatham.
