WHERE THEY WILL GO AND WHEN

Party will Leave Fredericton on December 27, Spending Almost Three Weeks Sightseeing in Boston, New York, Washington and Bermuda

So many inquiries have been made as to the itinerary of the tour to be given the winners in the voting contest, that a rough sketch has been drawn up. Its general outline will be followed, with few if any important changes.

Its members will be taken to Boston from Fredericton by rail, where one day will be spent in sight-seeing. From Boston to New York over the Fall River line. On arrival at this, the greatest city of the U. S., our party will board a large ocean steamer bound for the famous and beautiful Bermuda Islands, some 700 miles away.

A competent conductor from one of the big tourist firms of New York will meet the party in Boston and accompany them on all their travels to look after their comfort and pleasure.

Two delightful days will be spent on the ocean. At length the Islands rise into view, emerald green and sparkling white in a placid sea of richest turquoise. The colored pilot comes aboard and guides the ship through the coral barrier that protects the land. Inside the reef the ship speeds along the coast for many miles, while the passengers enjoy a panorama of low, rolling, verdure-crowned hills, white houses nestling among the richest foliage, palms and cedars and tropical flowers, changing with every mile. At last the capital of Bermuda, (Hamilton), is reached, a charming picture as the steamer reaches the wharf. On the pier are gathered many people, for the arrival of the New York steamship is an event in Bermuda. The formalities of the customs house are quickly and courteously transacted and serve chiefly to remind the visitor that he is in another land, but still within the realms of His Majesty King George V. Carriages will be provided to take The Mail's party to the big Hamilton hotel, where headquarters will have been reserved for them in advance.

Six days will be spent in Bermuda.

The many places of interest on these beautiful islands can be thoroughly explored. The scenery is diversified and the vegetation luxuriant; palms and many brilliant flowering trees and shrubs, the brilliant plumage of the birds, and the picturesque coast line, with its coral reefs, forming a constant succession of lovely pictures. Bermuda is an important naval military depot of Great Britain, and the presence of the garrison contributes greatly to the social attractions of the place, while the red-coats and bluejackets add variety to the street scenes.

Carriages will be provided on one day for the drive to St. Georges, a picturesque old town, once the capital of the Islands. Visit en route to the Devil's Hole and view the remarkable collection of many species of beautiful tropical fishes. A steamship trip to the reefs is made to view the "Sea Gardens"—coral grottoes. A trip in glass-bottomed boats is provided that our party may view the beautiful aquatic plants, anemones, sea fans, fish, etc., in their native element at the bottom of the sea. The royal dockyard is visited on the excursion, also the celebrated Bermuda aquarium, one of the world's finest collections.

Other entertainments and excursions are being arranged for the party, so that their stay on the Islands will be one round of pleasure and profit, from an educational standpoint. The visit to Tom Moore's house, in which he lived in 1804, will be of special interest to lovers of the great Irish bard. Mr. Moore wrote of Bermuda:

Could you but view the scenery fair,
That now beneath my window lies,
You'd think that nature lavished here
Her purest wave, her softest skies.

ON TO NEW YORK.

Leaving Bermuda our party will be taken to New York on the Quebec Steamship Co.'s fine new steamer, "Bermudian," a trip requiring two days and nights. In New York two days will be profitably spent, the mornings in riding about the city in the great touring cars, the afternoons in visiting the shopping districts, the art galleries and museums of natural history. On both evenings one of the famous Broadway theatres will be visited, members of the party being allowed to choose the play they would most like to see. Among the most notable places to be visited while in New York are: Wall Street, Trinity Church, the Battery, the Aquarium, Flatiron Building, Singer Building, Madison Square and the famous Metropolitan Life Building, Central Park, Grant's Tomb, etc.

Leaving for Washington on the night train, our party will have three delightful days in that city. The itinerary includes visits to Congressional Library, the Mint, Senate Chamber, all Government Buildings, Mount Vernon, and a drive along the famous Potomac.

Returning by way of New York again, our party will visit Boston and then return home by rail, tired out but happy and full to bursting with delightful reminiscences of a splendid tour with which to regale their friends.

Ottawa, October, 17—Application for jobs in the government service and the demands for the dismissal of people now holding such positions are pouring upon the new Minister, but so far little action along that line has not been taken. It is understood that the government has no intention of initiating the spoils system, but that if changes are made it will be among those who have been actively partisan in the election.

The only people affected so far in the service at Ottawa are private secretaries, who retain their clerkships, but lose the \$600 of extra remuneration which attaches to the secretarial position.
