> "It is con'idently expected that the increased demand and increased output will result in furth r savings in he cost of manufacture and distribution, and it is the policy of your directors to give your customers the enefit of these reductions.

This is further evidenced by the announcement, which was made on November 1st, 1911, of a still further reduction in the price of cement. The eduction in some districts is 10 cts. per harrel, and in others 5 cts. On the whole it will probably average 7 cts. per barrel. This reduction-with the reduction made last year-means a very large saving to the coment conur ars of Canada.




