Montreal, Nov. 21—That there is still a slight hope that the famous Hebert-Clonater marriage annulment case on which it was expected the validity of the Ne Temere decree in Canada would be finally decided may be carried on through the courts to a final decision, was shown this morning when Mr. Arnold Wainwright of the Counsel for Mrs. Hebert delayed asking for the judgment which will finally close the case and leave the principals in exactly the same position as they were before the matter was brought before the courts.

CANADIAN HORSES AGAIN WON HONORS

New York, Nov. 22—Canada carried off the honors in the feature event of the National Horse Show last night. Sixteen officers' horses, including the pick of the United States cavalry, Canadian Militia and Belgian Army, were displayed in a broad water jump competition for a cup and cash prize, but only one succeeded in wholly clearing the water. The winner was "Be Thankful," owned by Major Joseph Kilgour of the Queen's Own Rifles, Toronto, and ridden by Lieut. Allan Case of the same regiment. In the judging of hunters, the blue ribbons went to the entries of Hon. Adam Breck of London, Ont.

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 22—With every prospect of the eclipsing all previous records in the matter of variety and brilliancy, the annual season of the Chicago Grand Opera Company opens in the Auditorium tonight with a performance of Saint-Saens' "Samson et Delilah." During the rest of the week the presentations will include Bizet's "Carmen," Donizetti's "Lucia di Lammermoor," Mozart's "Le Nozze di Figaro," Verdi's "Il Trovatore," Verdi's "Messa da Requiem," Massenet's "Cendrillon" and Verdi's Traviata.

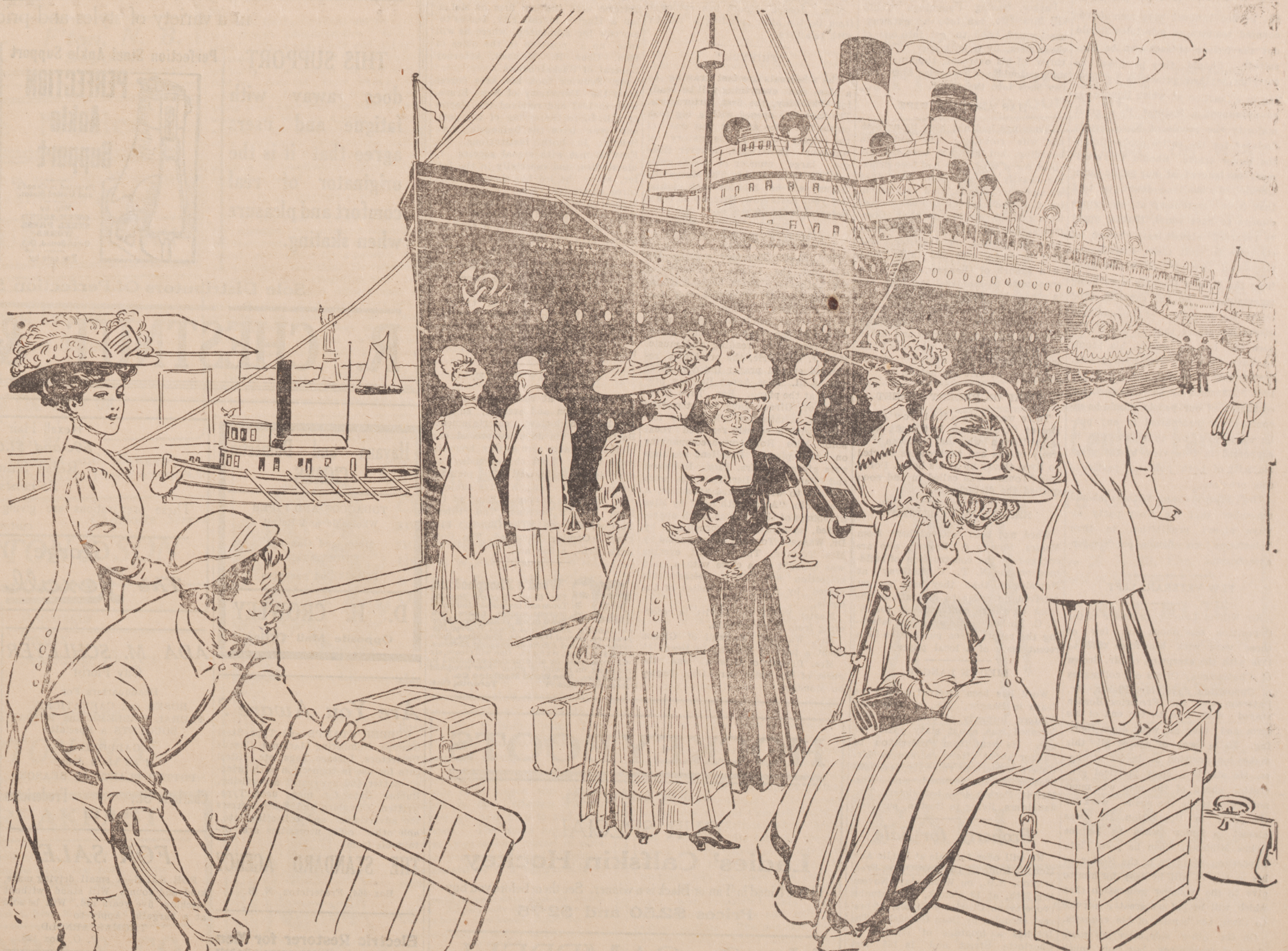
