## CURTAINMENT OF 70 P. C. ON AROOSTOOK CUT

Bangor, Me., Nov. 21.—The Aroostook log cut this winter will show a decrease of about 70 percent according to lumber men concerned with the situation who say that the operators in northern Maine will cut only about one third of the timber harvest of former years. Three factors are the lumber market which has been off this season and which causes some curtailment, the fact that many operators had logs to the extent of 10,000,000 feet hung up on St. John and Aroostook County rivers because of the low pitch of water, and the repeal of the Pike Law which went into effect at Augusta and which puts a duty of \$1.25 a thousand feet on American lumber manufactured in New Brunswick.

Hastings, Neb., Nov. 22.—Bishop Tihen of Lincoln officiated at impressive exercises here today at the laying of the cornerstone of the new Catholic Church. When completed the church will cost about \$60,000, and will be one of the finest Catholic edifices in Nebraska.

## UNITED STATES EXPRESS ENQUIRY BEGINS TODAY

New York, Nov. 22.—The Interstate Commerce Commission began a series of important hearings in this city today with the object of determining whether the rates charged by the big express companies doing business in the United States are reasonable and just. The investigation is regarded as one of the most important that the commission has yet undertaken. It is the direct result of numerous complaints received from commercial organizations and individual shippers in all parts of the country. There complaints have cited many alleged abuses incident to the regulations and practices of the express companies. The commission will endeavor to find out why the express companies persist in keeping their tariff practically secret. The basis of their division of profits with the railroads, also will receive attention. The express companies have shown some disposition to oppose the investigation and it is not expected inside facts in the matter will be gained except as the result of a strenuous fight.

Kansas City's board of public welfare had \$125,000 to spend during its first year of 1910, and this year has over \$200,000. It has a free local aid bureau, lodging house bureau and employment bureau.

"Holy mother!" cried the man who was viewing my features in the glare of his lantern. "Are you not the American—the Señor St. John?"

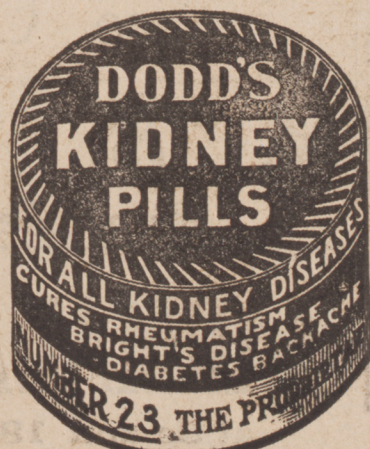
Before I answered I jumped up leaned over the front seat and, addressing both Yaqui and Romero, whispered:
