CRONJE A TYPICAL

BOER LEADER

(Toronto Globe.)
Pietrus Arnoldus Cronje, whose death took place at Klerksdorp, was in some ways the most conspicuous of the Boer leaders in the South African war eleven years ago. Born in 1835, he became a successful farmer, but, like other Boers who made a military reputation, he became also an adept at war through the almost incessant struggles with both the native tribes and the British forces. He contributed to the Boer victory at Majuba Hill in 1881, and in 1896 he suppressed with ease the perpetrators of the Jameson Raid. When the war broke out he was entrusted with the defence of the western part of the Transvaal and of the Orange Free State. He laid siege to Kimberley and checked the advance northwards of the relieving army under Lord Methuen, but was afterwards forced to retire up the Modder River eastward toward Bloemfontein. His retreat was conducted with consummate skill, but he was overtaken, surrounded and forced to surrender at Paardeberg, where a brilliant dash by a small Canadian contingent made further defence impossible. By a curious irony the date of his surrender and that of the British calamity at Majuba Hill were the same; the twenty-seventh of February. General Cronje remained a prisoner in St. Helena till the close of the war, and there can be little doubt that the latter would have been much more

MAN KILLS HIMSELF

St. Andrews, N. B., Feb. 8.—(Special)—Levi Coll, 70 years old, a fisherman living at Barnes Island, one of the Deer Island group, blew his head almost to pieces with a shot gun yesterday morning. He complained of suffering of severe pains in his head and body. His sons started for a physician but when they returned they found that he had taken his life. He put the muzzle of the gun in his mouth and used a lath to pull the trigger. He is survived by an aged widow, two daughters and four sons. In his early manhood he had fought with the Massachusetts Infantry in the war with the south.

LIBERALS WON P. E. I.

BYE-ELECTION

Charlottetown, P. E. I., Feb. 8.—The local bye-election in the second district of Queens county today came off amid much excitement. The Liberal candidate, George W. McPhee, a barrister of Charlottetown, defeated the Conservative candidate, John H. Buntain, of Rustico, by thirty-three votes, the total vote being: McPhee 820, and Buntain, 787. The Liberal majority in 1908 was 126. The total votes exceeded that of 1908 by 100. Previous to this election the standing of the parties was: Liberal, fourteen; Conservatives fourteen, not including the vacant seat. The return of the opposition candidate would have meant a general election.
