### FARM HOMES DISCUSSED AT COUNTRY LIFE CONGRESS

Spokane, Wash., Nov. 24.—This was "Farm Home Day" on the program of the National Country Life Congress in session in this city and it included the discussion of a wide variety of questions relating to home life in the rural communities and the work of the grange. Prominent among those who contributed papers or addresses were Joseph E. Wing of Mechanicsburg, O.; Prof. P. G. Holden, head of the agricultural extension department of Iowa State College; Mrs. Clara H. Waldo, of Portland, Ore., and Clifford Willis, of Minneapolis.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 24.—The convention of the National Rivers and Harbors Congress which is to assemble in this city week after next will have among its leading speakers the presidents of all the prominent river improvement organizations of the country. Included among the number will be Col. John L. Vance, for many years president of the Ohio Valley Improvement Association; Edgar C. Ellis, president of the Missouri River Improvement Association; Senator Duncan U. Fletcher of Florida, president of the Mississippi-to-Atlantic Inland Waterway Association; Thomas Wilkinson, president of the Upper Mississippi River Improvement Association; J. Hampton Moore, president of the Atlantic Deeper Waterway Association, and W. K. Kavanaugh, president of the Lakes-to-the-Gulf Deep Waterway Association.

### ATTENTION OF ALLIANCE TO BORDEN BANQUET

Halifax, N.S., Nov. 24.—The executive of the Nova Scotia Temperance Alliance at a meeting today, adopted a resolution placing on record their appreciation of the action of Lieut. Governor McGregor in excluding the use of intoxicating liquors at social and public functions in Government House. The other resolution adopted was as follows:

"We deeply regret that at the recent political banquet given by the Conservatives, the committee of management, ignoring the request of the general secretary of the Alliance, and following the usual custom of such occasions, provided intoxicating liquors."

Having learned that at the military conference in Ottawa it was proposed that the sale of alcoholic drinks be permitted in connection with the cadet service in the Canadian militia, the Nova Scotia Temperance Alliance most earnestly protests against such action.

They also request the management of all political and social gatherings to make no provision for the sale of intoxicating liquors.

### CHARITIES AND CORRECTION

Roanoke, Va., Nov. 25.—Many visitors are arriving in Roanoke to take part in the ninth annual meeting of the Virginia Conference of Charities and Correction. Special service will be held in several of the churches tomorrow and on Monday and Tuesday the conference will hold its business sessions. Governor Mann of Virginia and Dr. H. H. Hart, of the Russell Sage Foundation, will be among the notable speakers.
