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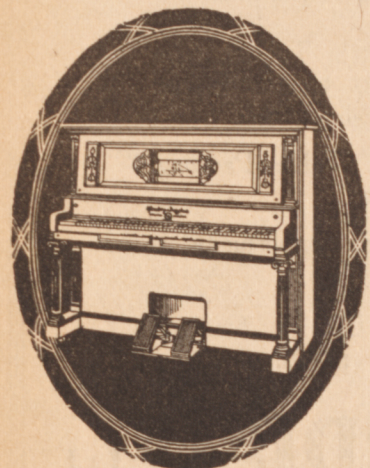

**NO ARMING GOING
ON IN ULSTER**

(London Mail)

In view of the publication of a number of rumors concerning a threat of armed resistance to any possible scheme of Home Rule, a special correspondent of this journal was recently dispatched to Ulster for the purpose of learning the actual facts. He has just returned having made a thorough investigation. His report is as follows:

No preparations are in progress at present anywhere in Ulster for armed resistance to Home Rule. The reports that large sums of money have been subscribed and large quantities of arms purchased with the view of concerted military measures—are merely reports. No arms are being imported either openly or surreptitiously beyond the normal demands of the trade.

None of the railway companies trading to the north of Ireland have records of carrying rifles or ammunition. The shipping companies report the same, and nothing has come from abroad of that nature so far as the Customs officers are aware. In the gunsmiths' shops not only sporting guns but military rifles are on sale, but no marked increase in trade is observable. On the contrary it is somewhat depressed.

No one blinks the facts that there will probably be rioting in Belfast and elsewhere, as, for instance, at Londonderry or Portadown. The followers of the two extreme political and religious parties meet daily in workshops, factories or shipbuilding yards. A slight thing will start an outbreak which may have serious results. There are no schemes devised for turning these sporadic outbreaks into organized movements by drilled disciplined, and well-armed men.

**L. J. KING HEARD
FROM IN ARIZONA**

Phoenix, Ariz., Jan. 29—"Rev." L. J. King, who was excommunicated from the Catholic Church, according to his own story, and now an Evangelist without a church, after delivering sermons offensive to many, especially Catholics, was advised to leave town Monday by the city marshal, and it was supposed he had done so. He did not go, but tonight began another sermon in Hardwick Theatre, after being warned by the police that the theatre license had expired. The police arrested him on the stage and escorted him to jail, followed by two score of people, a part of whom went in sympathy. The charge is technically a disturbance of the peace, made possible by acts, though the animus is from the objectionable sermons. He says he will furnish bonds at once.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-
WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
