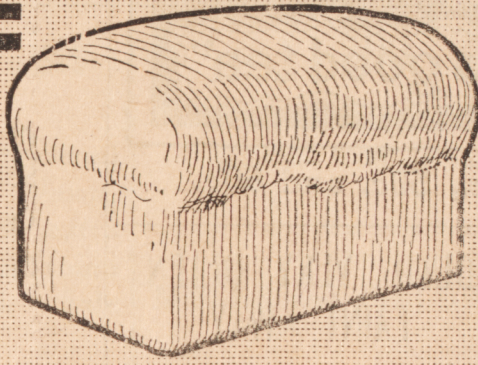

Paris, March 13.—Two persons were injured in a revolver duel over a woman at the Cafe Morris early today. One of the combatants was a wealthy Missouri man named Lee, while the other was a dancer named Morris, also from the United States.

Morris was seriously injured and Lee was shot in the leg. It is said that Lee has for some time been paying attentions to a dancer who has been appearing with Morris, and that the latter had warned his compatriot to stay away from the theatre.

HAZEN IS MUM ON RECIPROCITY

Ottawa, March 13.—Premier Hazen, of New Brunswick, is in the city to argue a case before the Supreme Court. When asked today for an expression of opinion on reciprocity, Mr. Hazen said he had none to express. He further intimated that his government would not submit to the provincial legislature now in session any discussion with reference to the subject though he added, the opposition was talking of bringing forward the matter. "It it does," he said, "we will deal with it, but I would regard such a resolution on their part as bad tactics."

Chicago, Ill., March 13.—Arrangements were completed last night for an automobile race between Emile Brouard, the French driver, who is in Chicago now, and Jack Johnson, the heavyweight champion fighter. The race will take place at Los Angeles Oakland within four weeks. It will be for 100 miles and both contestants are to drive ninety horse power machines.

FORMER FREDERICTONIAN FOR RECIPROCITY

An old Fredericton boy who has made good in the West and is now handling a large lumber business in the Middle West, on the Missouri River, writing to a friend in this city refers to reciprocity as follows:

"I most heartily favor the proposed agreement and of course, sincerely hope for its acceptance by both governments, which I believe will ultimately result, unless its enemies in both countries should succeed in their efforts to scare Canada with a lot of foolish annexation talk. Representative Bennett of New York, who recently introduced a resolution in Congress to annex Canada, voted against reciprocity when it passed in the House, thus proving that his annexation resolution was intended for Canadian consumption only. While greatly regretting the apparently long continued and possibly permanent separation of the two countries, I would deplore any serious annexation talk at this time or for that matter at any future time unless the same was mutually desired, for it would unquestionably mean the doom of the proposed agreement."

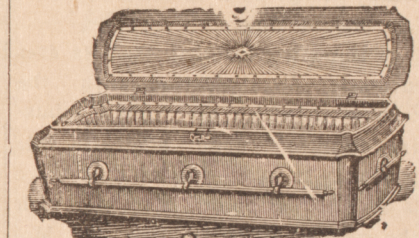

compares with it as a political asset. But of course, I do not mean to convey the idea that the sentiment here is unanimously in favor of it, for, as you doubtless will know, quite the contrary is true, which is very, very natural in a country where a high protective tariff has for many years been its one distinctive national policy—a policy to which I have always subscribed, but which I now oppose, for I believe in the gradual lowering of all duties, and as the best means of accomplishing the same, I would negotiate reciprocity treaties.

Now, I believe that protective tariffs have been highly beneficial to the development of the industries of this country, but high rates are now no longer required. Taking a narrow and somewhat selfish view of the proposed Canadian-American agreement, I might feel constrained to oppose it on account of the lumber schedule, and as a matter of fact, many lumbermen are opposing it. But I do not believe it will injure us much if any, out here.

It is incurring the opposition of some of the insurgent Senators, I believe, because it fails to include a sufficient number of manufactured articles on which there is now a high duty. I hope the Senate will speedily unseat Lorimer and pass the reciprocity agreement without having an extra session of Congress."

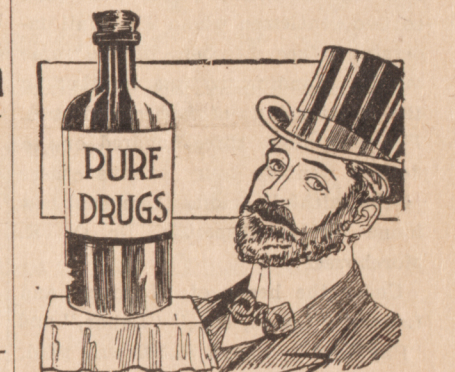
