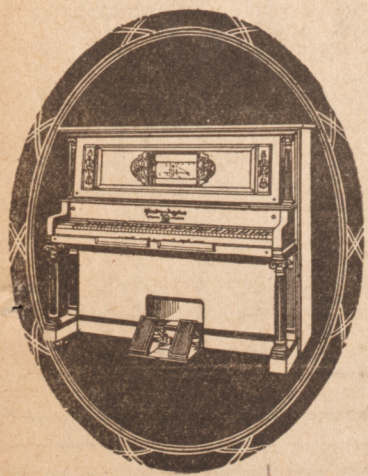

M.P.'S WHO WILL GO TO THE CORONATION

Ottawa, March 10.—The Liberal members of the Commons who will go with the parliamentary delegation to the coronation as the guests of the British parliament have been agreed upon. They are Ralph Smith member for Nanaimo, representing British Columbia; George E. McCraney, Saskatoon, representing Saskatchewan; Dr. Clark, Red Deer, representing Alberta; Hugh Guthrie, South Wellington, representing Ontario; Dr. Beland, Beauce, representing Quebec; F. B. Carvell, Carleton, representing New Brunswick; J. E. Sinclair, Guysboro, representing Nova Scotia; and A. B. Warburton, Queens representing Prince Edward Island. Manitoba will be represented by either Senator Watson or Senator Findlay Young.

The members selected to represent the opposition side of the House are Hon. John Haggart, Hon. Geo. E. Foster, H. B. Ames, Dr. Daniel and J. A. Magrath.

PREFERRED DEATH TO BEING A CRIPPLE

Chicago, March 11.—Thrown from one train and struck by another, which severed his left leg and arm, Edward Wolf, 17 year old, last night made the instant choice of death as the alternative to life as a hopeless cripple. Fighting off the faintness induced by his injuries, he managed to reach into his pocket with his remaining hand, draw a revolver and put a bullet in his brain.

The bullet which made a suicide of Wolf almost claimed another life, for it passed completely through the head of the self slayer and hit his travelling companion Wm. Haines 18 years old. Haines was struck in the neck and physicians who removed the bullet later found that it has just grazed the jugular vein. Wolf and Haines ran away from home in New York City a month or more ago. They were consumed with an ambition to see the west and travelled on freight and passenger trains as far as Denver. They became homesick and turned back.

BANK CASHIER MADE BIG HAUL

Frankford, March 13.—Following the suspension of the two states bank at Stephensport, Ky., on order of Secretary of State Bruner, Cashier John S. Adair has disappeared. An investigation of the bank's books shows that the bank has been looted of over \$80,000.

TOLSTOI HAD HAPPY HOME LIFE

New York, March 11.—"What do you know about me?" asked Count Leo Tolstoi, son of the late Count Tolstoi, "I am only the son of a great man."

Count Tolstoi came here yesterday on the Mauretania and will visit America to study socialism. At the concert given on shipboard last night at which Sir Edward Tennant presided, Count Tolstoi spoke for ten minutes, telling of the last days of his father. Count Tolstoi repudiated the stories which have gained circulation that the elder Tolstoi left his home to die because of domestic dissension.

"His life was a very happy one," said the young man. "He loved his home and his family, but in the later days of his life, Lord Redstock, the English evangelist, obtained great influence over him. Lord Redstock persuaded my father that the life he lived in his comfortable home was not in accord with theories he professed. Acting on this my father left his home. The end of that weary pilgrimage is known to all the world. There was no less affection on his part toward his family. His action was taken to demonstrate the theory of the life he had always urged."
